

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Unclassified Highway from Washpool Lane to the Hannington Road

Members of the Parish Council met with Quarry operators Earthline, their planning consultants, Gloucestershire Highways and our County Councillor to look at ways to reduce the regularly flooding of this highway. The meeting was very constructive and a plan to rectify the situation put forward. It will require permission from Gloucestershire Highways and we will update you on its progress shortly.

Increase in thefts from sheds, garages and outbuildings

Planning applications lodged

Ref: 13/0097/CWMAJM

Applicant: Aggregate Industries UK Limited

- **Proposal:** Extension of sand and gravel extraction operations including the retention of all existing site administration, processing and access facilities, with restoration of the extension and existing site to agriculture and species rich grassland using imported inert materials to recreate the original land form.
- Location: Manor Farm Quarry, Washpool Lane, Kempsford, Gloucestershire, GL7 4NJ

The proposed extension comprises 84.7 hectare to the north and east of the existing Manor Farm Quarry. The area will release an additional 3.2 million tonnes of sand and gravel, extending the life of the mineral excavation for a further 16 years, to 2030.

The restoration scheme seeks to return the whole Manor Farm site back to original ground levels using imported inert materials. The whole site will require approximately 3.1 million m3 of inert material to return the site back to original ground levels and this will take approximately 30 years to complete (2047).

All the related documents are available to view through the public access system on Gloucestershire County Council's website, and a link is provide through the 'current planning' page on the Kempsford Parish Council's website.

There is a huge amount of documents to support the application, but a non-technical summary is available from Heaton Planning Consultants which can be contacted by email—spencer@heatonplanning.co.uk or by telephone—0115 937 5552.

The comment deadline is the 25th April 2014 and residents are encourage to submit comments through the Public Access website where possible because it makes the whole process easier to handle and where letters are sent that an email address is still provided.

- Concerns over increased flood risk to Whelford village following restoration
- Increase in HGV traffic through Kempsford (61% increase).
- Noise, dust and air quality impact on the closest residential properties

The above application has progressed and is expected to be considered by Cotswold District Council for approval shortly.

There has been a number of changes to the layout since the application was first submitted following consultation with the School and Parish Council. Details of the changes are listed below—

- Change of access to car park. Access is now proposed from the main entrance on Top Road.
- Removal of the small community building— The equivalent sum (£33,458) will be paid to the Parish Council to be used by the Parish Council for improvement and repair works to the Village Hall or to deliver facilities appropriate to the development and the future benefit of the community.
- Construction of a new footpath from the Car Park to the High Street.
- Addition of a children's play area

Council provides WW1 commemoration funding

Cotswold District Council's Cabinet has agreed to provide each Councillor with a one-off allocation of £500 to fund activities marking the centenary of the First World War. From mid-February, each Member will receive an allocation of £500 to help fund activities or events in their wards which will commemorate the conflict.

Applying for funding will be very simple and will not differ much from the current process which enables CDC Councillors to allocate funding for youth projects.

Commenting on this initiative, CDC Leader Cllr Lynden Stowe said:

"As the momentum builds towards this significant anniversary, we thought it would be appropriate to provide each Councillor with a one-off sum of money to help honour local people who lost their lives or distinguished themselves in battle. We are not applying restrictive criteria to applications for funding but we are already aware that there will be interest from various communities that are planning events or activities such as local exhibitions, renovation of war memorials, and the provision of commemorative plaques and publications. It's also possible that the funding might be used to stimulate interest and attract financial backing from other sources."

ELECTORAL REVIEW OF COTSWOLD: DRAFT RECOMMENDATIONS

Following the earlier consultation regarding the ward boundaries for Cotswold District Council, the LGBCE have announced the publication of their draft recommendations for Cotswold District Council. Summary

The aim of the electoral review is to deliver electoral equality for voters in local elections, by recommending ward boundaries that mean each councillor represents approximately the same number of electors. At present, some councillors represent many more, or fewer, electors than other elected members elsewhere in the district which means the value of your vote varies depending on where you live in Cotswold.

The review is being carried out following a request from Cotswold District Council for the Commission to consider the number of councillors elected to the council and to deliver a pattern of wards that means each ward is represented by one councillor—a 'single-member ward review'.

Cotswold District Council currently has 44 councillors. It is proposed that the council should have 34 councillors in future. The Commission believes that a council size of 34 members will ensure the council can discharge its roles and responsibilities effectively and provides for a warding pattern that meets our statutory criteria.

The draft recommendations propose that Cotswold's 34 councillors should represent 32 single-member wards and one two-member ward across the district.

What does this mean for Kempsford Parish?

We would change from the present two-member ward comprising Lechlade and Kempsford to a single-member Fairford South & Kempsford Ward.

It would include the Fairford area south of the A417 with Kempsford Parish. Also included is an area of housing on the A417 on the edge of Lechlade as well as the streets of Moorgate and The Wern. The boundary would run north along Bryworth Lane to Hambridge Lane following it to the parish boundary between Lechlade and Southrop.

RAF Fairford Activities

Residents may remember the threshing machine that was used last year to remove the bird attractants (grubs, seeds etc.) from the grass on the airfield. This process is due to start again on 14 April, and the threshing will last for around 3 weeks. The machinery used will be different to last year (and hopefully quieter but no

guarantees). Two local farmers will carry out the work. Working hours have been discussed with the contract manager, and they will be told to work away from the residential areas at weekends, and to limit the start and end time to a sociable hour. This activity is required to minimise the risk of bird strike, but hopefully we have reduced the irritant to local residents as much as we can.

Work will commence on taking down around 10 willow trees at the bottom of site 16 (Washpool Lane) reducing them to around 2m in height. This is the start of clearing up the area alongside Dudgrove Brook, with the aim of carrying out some de-silting later in the year.

NURSING TEAM PASS WITH FLYING COLOURS

PRESS RELEASE

The Home Nursing service run by the League of Friends of Fairford Hospital has passed its inspection by the Care Quality Commission with flying colours. All six standards required by the regulator of health and social care in England were met and the inspectors found many examples of praise for the service from the public.

The inspection team acknowledged that the service had experienced an increase in demand since the closure of in-patient beds at Fairford leading to a growth in the staff team since the last inspection. The feedback from the families of people using the service was exceptionally positive, says the report, with comments such as "everyone was very kind to me"; "they were absolutely excellent"; and "they are very well trained."

They found that "the district nursing team were totally supportive of the service" and quoted a district nurse as commenting: "I cannot fault anything they do – they have been a lifeline to us.

The inspection covered areas such as ensuring patients consented when it came to having treatment; care and welfare, ensuring treatment was planned and delivered in a way that was intended to ensure people's safety and welfare; the management of medicines; and staff qualification and management. There was general agreement among staff, patients and their families that there were no time pressures on staff. They were enabled to deliver a great service and provide whatever support was required without having to rush.

League of Friends chairman, Graham Hewitt commented: "We are really proud of what our nursing team has been able to achieve in providing the care that is so desperately needed."
