TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF VARIOUS PUBLIC FOOTPATHS
(FAIRFORD AND KEMPSFORD PARISHES) COTSWOLD DISTRICT

NOTICE is hereby given that Gloucestershire County Council has made an Order to close temporarily under Sections 14, 15 and 16 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1984 (as amended) part of various Public Footpaths as defined in the Schedule below:

SCHEDULE

Public Footpath BKD 35 in the Parish of Kempsford is to be closed temporarily from its junction with the Whelford Road at Ordnance Survey Grid Reference (OSGR) SU 17617/ 99953 extending in a generally westerly direction for a distance of approximately 210 metres to OSGR SU 16972/99998 (Point B) and then carrying on along BFA 32 in the Parish of Fairford for a further 1100 metres in a north westerly direction to its junction with Public Footpath BFA 31 at OSGR SP 16328/00405 and shown on the Map by a bold solid black line marked A to B to C to D.

Public Footpath BFA 30 in the Parish of Fairford is to be closed temporarily from its junction with Public Footpath BFA 32 at OSGR SP 16841/00306 extending in a generally northerly direction for a distance of approximately 500 metres and then in a westerly direction for a further 700 metres to its junction with Public Footpath BFA 33 at OSGR SP 16286/00780 and shown on the Map by a bold solid black line marked C to E.


The footpaths fall within the Parishes of Fairford and Kempsford in the Cotswold District, in the County of Gloucestershire.

The closure is necessary to in the interest of public safety during construction works.

The Order will come into force on the 22nd March 2021. These closures can remain in force for six months. However, if the works have not been completed by this date it will be necessary to apply to the Secretary of State for an extension of time.

Alternative Route – There is no alternative route.

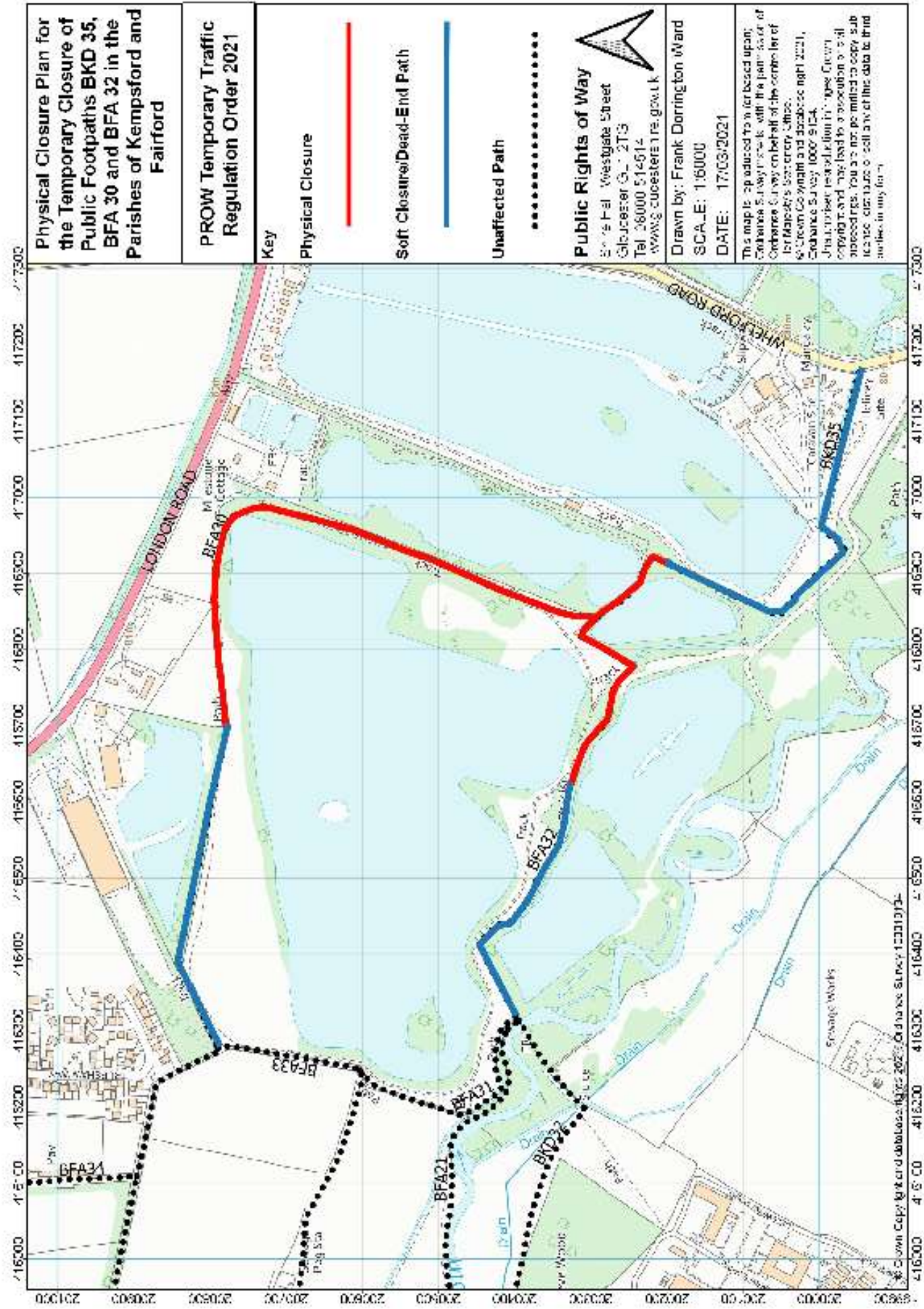
Emergency access and pedestrian access will be maintained.

Waste Water Problems in Kempford

Houses, particularly in the Holford Crescent and Lancaster Road area of Kempford, have been suffering from waste water problems which have made the downstairs toilets, washing machines and Dishwashers unusable. The problems were traced back to the pumping station near the Church, where the 2 pumps were damaged and were unable to disperse the waste. Tankers have had to be called to remove the waste before they can repair the pumps. The pumps were damaged by materials which should not have been disposed of down the toilets or sinks.

Please do not dispose of items such as disposable nappies, sanitary items and wet wipes down the toilets as these contain plastic which do not break down. Fats and oils should not be disposed of down the sink as they cool to form **“Fatbergs” in the system.**



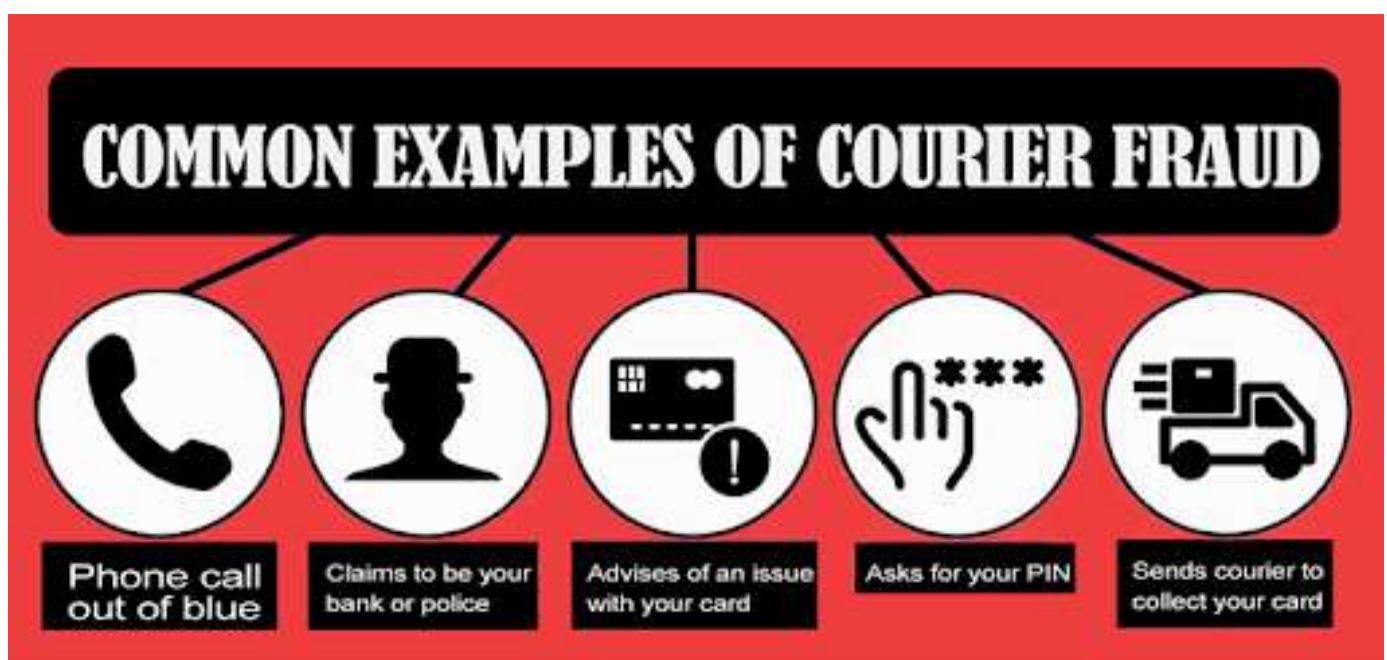
Your Community Alerts is Gloucestershire Constabulary's new, free messaging system that enables residents, businesses and community groups to participate in a two-way exchange of information about what is happening throughout the county. Whether you live in Gloucester, Cheltenham, Tewkesbury, Stroud, the Forest of Dean or the Cotswolds you can receive up-to-date messaging about incidents that may affect you.

Don't worry, we won't bombard you with every incident. You can choose exactly the type of alert you wish to receive. For example, you can help tackle crime by registering for witness appeals or keep ahead of those traffic jams by registering for road closure alerts. The aim is to send relevant information which is chosen by you and together we can make a greater impact on the prevention and detection of crime and anti-social behaviour in our communities.

The service is entirely free and you can receive the messages in a way that suits you. You may subscribe to alerts via text, an alert through the mobile app, a text or a voicemail. The choice is your hands.

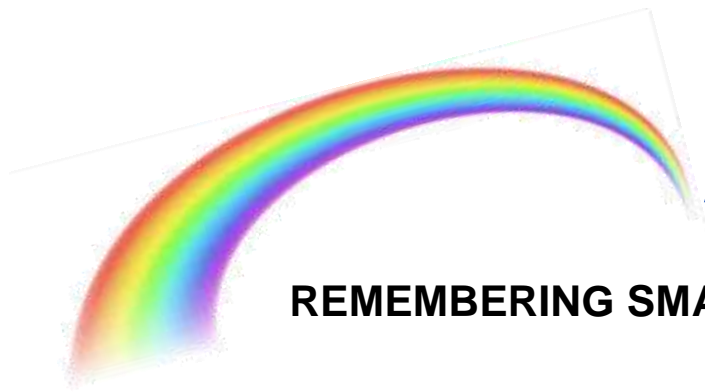

Building Repairs at St Mary's church, Kempstford

Over the coming weeks building repair works are due to take place at **St Mary's church in Kempstford**. **St Mary's has been awarded £12,000 towards this vital work from the government's £1.57 billion Culture Recovery Fund** which is administered by Historic England, with the rest coming from our fabric fund reserves. These reserves mainly originate from legacies received over a number of years. The work should not affect access to the church for normal worship (subject to Government Covid-19 rules).

The upkeep of our churches in Kempstford and Whelford is an ongoing task, made more difficult by their age and status as **grade 1 and grade 2 listed buildings respectively**. **Further work on St Mary's church** will be needed as well as work on the porch and guttering at **St Anne's church in Whelford**. **Whilst it is hoped we will be able to** secure further grants for some of this work, it is likely that we will have to fund part of the repairs ourselves and will be targeting some of our fundraising towards this.

TYPE 2 DIABETES

KNOW YOUR RISK

We are trying to increase awareness and access to the NHS National Diabetes Prevention Programme (NDPP) for residents within the Gloucestershire area.

The Gloucestershire Diabetes Prevention programme is a free service for people who are at high risk of developing type 2 diabetes.

The Diabetes Prevention Programme is a behaviour change programme where people learn about, diet, physical activity and strategies to improve their overall health, all aimed at reducing their risk of developing Type 2 Diabetes.

Normally, people access the programme through their GP however, due to the pandemic and the subsequent pressure that our GP practices are facing, for a limited time we have enabled a self-referral option via the Diabetes UK 'Know Your Risk Score' – a check list of questions that can determine a person's risk factors - This has also enabled the programme to become more accessible to people within the area.

Walk 3: Whelford Pools, Lakes by Yoo and Bowmoor Sailing Lake

Distance: **3.1mi**

Elevation: **21ft**

Time: **1:03:10**



This month we are visiting 3 different zones – firstly the Whelford Pools Nature Reserve (WPNR) which belongs to the Gloucestershire Wildlife trust (GWT). Secondly Lakes by Yoo to see some posh box like houses, which like marmite, you either love ‘em or hate ‘em, and thirdly for the sporty types, Bowmoor Sailing Lake. Here besides sailing you can paddleboard or swim. I did this walk in trainers but mid-March is too early for that as there are some very muddy bits!

The walk starts at the WPNR carpark which is ~100m after the Dudgrove turning. After you have got into the reserve you will see a new bird hide – have a look across the lake from inside (pic 1). Go to the left and next you will see the dipping platform. We (GWT volunteers) recently extended this (with help from Bruce Arkell’s farm) – you may interested in trying identify what is in the pond (pic 2). On the left there is a fishing lake, and on the right you can hide behind a screen (again built by GWT volunteers) to spot cormorants, egrets, terns, swans and duck. Sometimes you can be here and the word has gone around that the lesser spotted “don’t ask me” has arrived from Siberia to create excitement amongst the “twitchers”



At the end of the path go across a bridge (pic 3). On the bridge you are looking towards Bowmoor Sailing Lake – turn right (the left turn is very muddy – you’ll experience this on the return). There is an interpretation map showing some of the foot paths. Carry on for perhaps ½ mile, with the Conservation Lake on your left and trees on your right. Then you will see the latest lodges that are being built on the Lakes by Yoo development (pic 4 taken just before entering the site). They are bigger than the original 2-storey boxes. We can now walk through LbY on various footpaths, thanks to battles fought by our clerk and others! Today we going to the first main junction just after a building that looks as if it will serve some purpose for the residents rather than being a dwelling. All will become clear soon no doubt. The track curves around and you will have a mini lake on your right and more new lodges ahead.



Take the left turn at the signpost and walk along a “fenced in” path. After a few minutes you will come to the Bowmoor Lake where if you want a shorter walk turn left. However I turned right and walked anti-clockwise around the lake, past the Coln Country Park car park (track wet here but in the summer you could park here and go part of the way with a buggy or wheelchair) and then past the entrance to the sailing lake. Soon we will be able to swim. Helen and her mates would be doing this now if it was open but March is too soon for “all bones and no meat” me.



Pic 5 shows a view across the lake so you can see where you have come from. Now the only tricky bit – finding the return route to WPNR but there is now better signage (pic6). This path is fenced in on both sides and was muddy with no escape. After 5 mins or so you will get back to the bridge and on to the car park.
