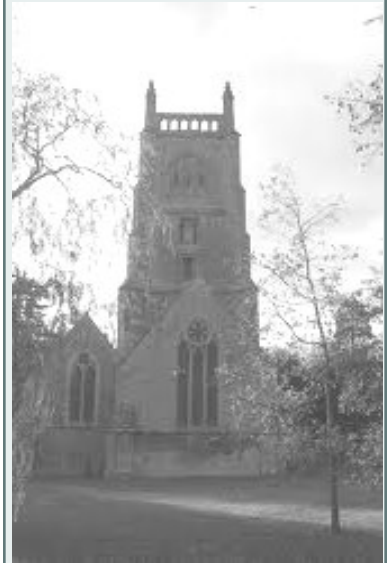

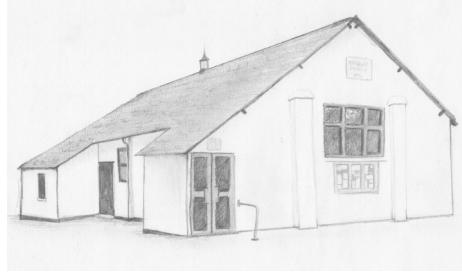

Many of you may have noticed a yellow box now at the side of The George.

Its installation has been made possible thanks to the generosity of the Gresham Wells Trust (Trustees – The Parish Council) and of the South Western Ambulance Service NHS Foundation Trust (SWASFT).

IN AN EMERGENCY Dial 999 or 112

If your call is deemed to be an appropriate emergency situation, you will be given the location of the nearest defibrillator and the access code for the box.

Ambulance call handling staff will also provide additional support and instructions as appropriate.

Awareness Sessions, aimed at familiarising those attending with the use of a defibrillator and how it could help you to save a life, are being planned. Details of those sessions will follow.

Gloucestershire Joint Waste team Master Composting Course available

Garden Organic, in conjunction with the Gloucestershire Joint Waste Team (GJWT) are looking to find volunteers who would like to become Master Composters, and are offering a free 2 day Master Composter initial training course this Spring. The course covers everything a volunteer needs in order to be confident enough to promote home and community composting within their community as a method of diverting waste. Following the training, there will be on-going support from both Garden Organic and the GJWT officers.

The sale of compost bins is one of the main ways the GWT can judge the take-up rate of home composting in Gloucestershire, and Master Composters are vital in helping us spread the word about the very reasonable compost bins that are for sale via the Recycle for Gloucestershire website <http://www.recycleforgloucestershire.com/article/113096/Home-composting> Master Composters are also expert trouble-shooters, and have helped many residents who have come across issues when beginning to compost at home.

The promotion of composting, compost bins, and other systems can be done in a variety of ways - from writing articles for local journals, having a stall at local fetes or even just talking to neighbours. Two of the existing Master Composters even have demonstration bins available for people to look at. There is also a variety of resources that people can borrow to enhance any Master Composter stalls that they may organise, such as leaflets, tablecloths, cut-away compost bins etc. From time to time there is also the opportunity to support the Gloucestershire Joint Waste Team officers at roadshows and events throughout the county, though the most successful Master Composters are usually people who proactively look for ways to promote composting themselves.

Volunteer Opportunities on the River Thames

The Environment Agency, which is navigation authority for the Thames, is now recruiting for the 2015 season and are looking for volunteers who can commit to assisting at least one day a week between May and the end of September. Volunteers can agree their days with lock keepers but need to be available from 10 to 5. Volunteering is a great way to meet people and to find out more about the Thames, its history, wildlife and management. At the same time volunteers know that they are doing something worthwhile that is really appreciated.

Our Volunteer Assistant Lock Keepers work alongside paid lock keepers. They help boats pass through the lock safely: taking ropes, directing traffic, and operating sluices and lock gates. They help maintain the site: painting, tidying and gardening. They provide information to visitors, be they on foot or afloat, so that they can make the best of their time on the river. Visitors really appreciate the local knowledge that volunteers can provide.

All applicants are invited to an assessment at a local lock. Here they will have the role explained to them and be shown what it involves in practical terms. They will also be assessed to decide which site may be most appropriate for them and to ensure that they have the physical capabilities required. After successful completion of the assessment, they attend an induction course which focuses on safety and preparing them for the lock side.

On the lock side the volunteers follow a documented training programme before being signed off to take charge of the lock on their own. This will only be for short periods, while the paid keeper is at lunch for example.

Volunteers are provided with uniform and can claim mileage for travel to and from a lock local to them. They also receive a monthly newsletter which keeps them in touch with what is going on along the river and other activities of the Environment Agency.
