

# Kempsford Parish Flood Plan

Parish Councillors recently attended a Flood Warden Launch Event at Cotswold District Council. The District Council is working in partnership with Gloucestershire Rural Community Council (GRCC) and town and parish councils to recruit local volunteer wardens to a new scheme helping to improve local flood preparation and responses.

The District Council will provide training, PPE, best practice guidance and other support to volunteer flood wardens, helping them in their role as 'eyes and ears' in their local communities. In this way, those with local knowledge will be well placed to ensure early intervention and to help create sustainable responses to flooding.

At the event, Bledington Village presented their Flood Plan and we are keen to produce a similar plan for Kempsford Parish with the help of the community.

Many of you may remember the flooding we experienced in July 2007 and historically the flooding that has previously occurred at Reevey in Kempsford. In 2015 Gloucestershire County Council undertook some flood alleviation works at Whelford. However, with an ever changing climate we do not know what the future holds!

We would like to hear from anyone in the Parish that has experienced flooding, whether it is from watercourses, surface water or drainage, to obtain a better understanding of the areas at risk.

We would also welcome any volunteers to assist in preparing the plan and to become Local Volunteer Wardens. Please contact the Clerk for further information.




# Food Bank

We are a small group of interested people who meet periodically to share information about the health and wellbeing of the river Thames from its source to Inglesham.

# What We Do.

We keep a watching brief on anything that may affect the river and liaise with other groups such as local councils, conservation groups, farming advisory groups, fishermen and monitoring organisations. Looking at such issues as

- Floodplain Meadows Partnership
- River Restoration
- Thames Path
- River Thames Erosion Project
- Fish Populations

We produce an annual newsletter covering issues arising during the year and at our AGM, usually held in October / November, we invite a guest speaker to talk on a subject which concerns the river.

We have also made small donations to aid or facilitate initiatives to improve conditions or habitats along the river.

# 80 Years of Continuous Service to the Community.

Life was very different 80 years ago when a local branch of the national Citizens Advice set up in the Dyer Street, Cirencester. It was 1941 and the height of the Second World War. Concerns of clients were understandably often related to the war, with many queries about food rationing, damaged clothes and property. As the war ended, questions about help with repatriation and food parcels became more common.

In current times, our top enquiry areas are benefit entitlements, debt, housing, energy, employment and family problems. We work closely with the North Cotswold and Cirencester foodbanks and enquiries about Food Vouchers continue to be high.

Advice given by well trained volunteers, backed up by a small number of staff was as key then as it is today,.

In 2013 we joined with Stroud Citizens
Advice to become Citizens Advice Stroud
and Cotswold Districts. We are a small local
charity who relies on support from our
District Councils, town and parish councils
and on donations from local organisations
and individuals. We also receive grants for
some of our project work. For many years
our work in the Cotswolds has been
supported by the Friends of Cotswold
Citizens Advice (a separate registered
charity). They raise funds, help with publicity
and most recently they have provided help

with funding to support advice at the Food Bank, and with computer costs.

The Friends recently helped raise funds with a street collection in Cirencester Market Place, coinciding with the Christmas Market on 5th December. They also wanted to ensure that the local community were aware of the 80 years of continuous service. Thanks to the sterling efforts of the Friends, with help from volunteer receptionists and advisers, a total of £227.31 was collected which will be increased through Gift Aid.
