#### Possible Telephone Scam Alert

Scam Alert (Sent on behalf of Cotswold Neighbourhood Inspector, Simon Ellson)

Cotswolds Police have been made aware today by local residents in Cirencester of a potential telephone scam.

Residents have informed Police that they are receiving a phone call from people pretending to be Police Officers and asking them to move money into a "safe account" Residents are told it is to "protect your money". You may be told you will be arrested if you don't do it.

Please don't do this, this is a scam. A Police officer would not call you and request you to move money, or threaten you with arrest for failing to pay money.

### Community Speed Watch

Gloucestershire police have now confirmed their involvement and support for villages to install Autospeedwatch devices.

Gloucestershire County Council has also launched a £600,000 Community Speed Watch Safety Fund in partnership with the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner. This fund will provide communities with the tools they need to combat speeding in their area, helping to make our roads safer for everyone who uses them to walk, cycle, and drive. It includes funding for Community Speedwatch cameras to help enforce speed limits, as well as vehicle activated signage.

However before such devices can be installed, the village is required to set up a Community Speedwatch Group to run alongside the ANPR camera.

The Parish Council has discussed obtaining AutoSpeedWatch devices for both Kempsford and Whelford.

Whelford residents are in the process of setting up a new Speed Watch Group for the village and the existing group lead by Andy Lee at Kempsford is looking to attract new volunteers.

We recently celebrated Queen Elizabeth's 70 years of service to our nation. She has spoken about her Christian faith in the past, how it has helps sustain and uphold her through the ups and downs of life. The example of Jesus Christ has inspired our Queen to live a life of service, turning outwards and working for the common good. This impulse is at the heart of British life where many volunteer for the good of others.

In Whelford, many people worked hard to create a wonderful event for the village to celebrate the Jubilee. 5 miles of bunting was made in the village hall, hundreds of sandwiches were made, 17 wonderful cakes were baked for the Bake Off Showstopper contest, and most of the village came along to enjoy the brass band and afternoon tea.

Sadly, in Kempsford there were not enough people to help organise a village event for the Jubilee. This has given rise to a fruitful conversation on the village Facebook page about the kind of village we want to be, and several new people have joined the Village Hall committee to help make things happen. I know Kempsford used to have a thriving village social life, and it would be wonderful to have that again. We have a village hall garden project that will enable many to garden and explore nature together in the heart of the village. There is also a village fete planned for Saturday 10<sup>th</sup> September that will need helpers for stalls, teas and games. Lots of opportunities to do things together for our village life!

We may be facing a tough time as a nation as we move towards autumn and winter, due to rising household costs. For young families and people who live alone, this may be especially difficult. In thinking about how we might support one another during this time, one idea is for the school hall to open after school once a week as Kempsford Community Hub, where a hot meal will be served from 3.30pm to 6pm for anyone who would like to come along, on a 'pay as you can' donation basis. There may be bingo, music, activities for children, and a warm place to be together and share a meal through autumn and winter. A number of volunteers will be needed on a rota basis, to prep, serve and clear away. We are exploring this further with a local Stroud charity who run The Long Table <a href="https://www.thelongtableonline.com">https://www.thelongtableonline.com</a> and an open meeting with Will and Tim from the Long Table will take place <a href="https://www.thelongtableonline.com">at the school hall on Monday 11<sup>th</sup> July at 6pm for anyone who wants to get involved, know more or sign up to come and eat! Please come along - let's rebuild our community spirit together.
