

Airfield Activity at RAF Fairford June 2015

RAF Fairford is home to the USAF 420th Air Base Squadron, which is part of the 501st Combat Support Wing at RAF Alconbury in Cambridgeshire. The base is maintained in a ready, "warm status" by a civilian workforce who are responsible for all daily tasks and contingency preparations.

The main mission at RAF Fairford is to be ready to receive a deployment of aircraft and personnel with 48 hours' notice, both for real-world scenarios and for training.

The mission at RAF Fairford will soon be put into action, as there is a training exercise scheduled to take place within the coming weeks.

During this time, you will notice a greater USAF presence at RAF Fairford with a temporary increase in American personnel working at the base, preparatory activities on the airfield and more frequent flight operations. RAF Fairford will only be used for take-off and landing, and flying exercises will take place elsewhere.

Contingency personnel will adhere to the posted quiet hours whenever possible; however, there may be some occasions where operational necessity may require them to operate outside of these published hours. The airfield quiet hours are:

Monday to Thursday 23:00 each evening to 06:00 the following morning

Weekends from 18:00 Friday evening until 06:00 Monday morning

We hope that activities at RAF Fairford are not too intrusive to local residents, and ask that residents are not alarmed by the military operations at RAF Fairford during this time.





Last year, the Active Together scheme successfully funded 226 community led sports and physical activity initiatives and projects across the county. Cotswold Community says "Bye-Bye" to Buying



Northleach residents have won a £700 award from Cotswold District Council

for their efforts to create a green community. At the heart of this is a new initiative known as Streetbank, a UK-wide movement of people who share with their neighbours boosting local communities.

People are tapping into a new kind of wealth – a greener, friendlier kind, where borrowing is the new buying. Set up in January, the Northleach Streetbank community quickly grew to some 60 members. Within a month they had entered and won a prize worth £700 in a gRRReen Awards competition which was run by Cotswold District Council in conjunction with their waste service provider Ubico Ltd and the Gloucestershire Joint Waste Partnership. The council's competition challenged local communities in the Cotswolds to come up with ways to reduce, reuse and recycle to decrease the amount of waste being sent to landfill. And this is exactly what the Streetbank group in Northleach is doing. Using a free website, members share within their community. Be it lending ladders, borrowing buggies or swapping sewing machines, they're borrowing not buying. The result? Less waste and less clutter.

"It all started when I needed a roof box, and it occurred to me that rather than buy a new one, maybe one of my neighbours would have one I could borrow. And that maybe there was a way of finding out if other people in my community would want to borrow and lend things to others in the town. I did some digging around online and discovered Streetbank. Very quickly I set a group up in Northleach. It's really easy to join and use and is a great way of bringing a community together."

Northleach resident and Streetbank champion Jenny Moss is confident this is just the beginning:

Cabinet Member for the Environment and Communities at Cotswold District Council, Cllr Sue Coakley, was full of praise for Jenny's initiative:

"When the Streetbank group applied for the GRRReen competition we had no hesitation in awarding them a £700 prize because they had such impressive plans for increasing the recycling and reuse of everyday items, while also reducing consumption of new goods. We also felt that this was a good model which could be replicated across the whole District. People are buying more items than ever before and an increasing number of quality goods are being thrown away. This is why it was so heartening to learn that the Northleach Streetbank group has been connecting with local groups and businesses such as the Town Council, Northleach Primary School, Fosse Lions Club and the church to raise their profile and attract more people to share resources. I also understand that they are working towards a Streetbank Day which will showcase their achievements and encourage even more sharing."

Across the country 1500 people are exchanging through Streetbank every month. There are over 60,000 members and it's the largest website of its kind with 38,000 things and 12,000 skills worth a total of £1.5m listed so far and it's now come to Gloucestershire. Using the fund won in the gRRReen Awards, Northleach Streetbank plans to expand not only in their community, but also within Gloucestershire, helping others set up their own groups.
