The Lechlade & District Lions Club is pleased to

announce their Second Open Water Swimming Race & Challenge to raise money for charity. This event will be held on Bowmoor Lake, courtesy of the Bowmoor Sailing Club on Saturday August 3rd.

The day will be split into a morning and afternoon session.

The morning session will be a 5Km race for experienced open water swimmers. A trophy will be awarded to the winner and is in memory of John Sheffield who organised our first event last year. The 5km Race starts at 10:00 am

The afternoon session is open to all competent swimmers who are capable of swimming at least 500m in a swimming pool. There will be four events to suit all levels of competence:

- 1. 200m swim close to the bank
- 2. 1000m around a 1km course marked by buoys
- 3. 2000m, twice round the 1km course
- 4. 3000m, three times round the 1km course.

All these events start at 12:00 noon, they are not races but an opportunity to challenge yourself and help raise money for charity.

The entry fee will be £25 for all the day's events. Each swimmer will be given a swim cap to wear during the event and a medal on completion. All entrants are encouraged to get themselves sponsored, you can download the entry form and sponsorship form at www.lechladelions.org.uk/owls. All the money raised will be shared 50/50 with the Wiltshire Air Ambulance and the Lions Charity fund.

Safety is a key consideration and all entrants are advised to wear a wet suit. The local scouts will be providing a monitoring and rescue service from several canoes strategically placed around the lake, and the Bowmoor Sailing Club rescue boats will be deployed.

Refreshments will be available for entrants, spectators and helpers for a nominal cost.

Dear Friends,

I have always had very mixed feelings about the month of June. It seems to start the summer properly, I have fond memories of very sunny days and my wife and I both have our birthdays in June, so it is one of celebration for us personally. For many years of school and University though, it was also a time of exams. When I became a teacher, although it wasn't me sitting the exams I still worried about them. Hoping that the students would do well, that there wouldn't be one of the really odd questions that trip people up and so on. Children are sitting their SATs as I write this and my heart goes out to them, their teachers and parents that at such a young age they seem to feel such pressure.

Stress seems to be one of the ever increasing problems of the modern world. We have developed so many wonderful things such as mobile phones, space travel and Lego (certainly my son thinks heaven is made of it anyway) and yet worries seem to be on the increase.

It may be the fault of modern media, through email, text and our phones we can find out immediately when something terrible has happened in the world. We can worry that someone has taken more than a few minutes to respond to a message we've sent them. What's happened, are they alright? The possibility that they might have missed it, or are just driving and can't respond for good reason is too often replaced with thoughts of injury or accident.

Prayers, meditation, mindfulness, all of these are rather good with helping to cope with stress. They won't necessarily free one from all anxiety, but they can provide that needed pause to reflect, to take stock and think more clearly. I used to tell my A level students I would pray for them in their exams. I remember one replying "Thanks, I'm going to need it!" I told him that he didn't need it, he was bright and able. I told him that I found it helpful, and also that it was part of my care for them as a teacher. As I almost never mentioned my own beliefs and wore a collar and tie (or shorts and T-shirt more often due to my PE duties) my being a Christian priest typically seemed something unreal to my students. When I left the school a year later I had a letter from that same student. It was very flattering (I have used it as a reference in job applications) and it recalled that moment. He mentioned how it had helped him to relax for the exam. There wasn't divine intervention, just a raising of awareness that this world has some people that care.

My prayers didn't help my students get straight A's. They haven't meant I have a stress free life and everything I could ever want, though I do have all I need. They help me make sense of some things, and cope with others. Prayer is not the answer to all our problems, but it certainly helps me and many others to get through them.


