

NOTICE OF VACANCY

NOTICE is given that, due to the resignation of Susan Griffin, a vacancy has arisen for a Councillor for the Parish Council.

The vacancy will be filled by election if a request from 10 local government electors for the Parish is received within 14 days of the date of this notice. The request must be received by 10 June 2020.

Requests should include each electors' name and address and should be sent to the Returning Officer at the address below or by email to elections@cotswold.gov.uk

If no requests are received by the date given, the Parish Council may fill the vacancy by co-option.

If an election is called, the Coronavirus Act 2020 and The Local Government and Police and Crime Commissioner (Coronavirus)(Postponement of Elections and Referendums)(England and Wales) Regulations 2020 regulations state that the by-election will not take place, and the vacancy will be held open.

The 2020 regulations provide for the by election to take place on Thursday 6 May 2021. However, this date may be brought forward or deferred by the Government depending upon the circumstances. Any election that is called will be duly publicised as required by law.

Becoming a Parish Councillor

By becoming a parish councillor you become someone your community will look to for help, guidance and support – a community leader with the power to influence decisions for the benefit of the people you serve.

Seeing your community change for the better, as a result of decisions you have helped make, is something that can give you a sense of achievement and pride.

Alternatively, you can <u>visit the Electoral Commissions website</u>. This webpage contains all the guidance and resources that you need if you are a candidate at a parish or community election in England.

Training

Training is not necessary, but is available for anyone interested

Eligibility

To stand for election on a parish council, you must:

- be a UK or Commonwealth citizen
- be a citizen of the Republic of Ireland
- be a citizen of another Member state of the European Union
- be at least 18 years old

To be eligible to stand for an election for a particular parish, you must:

- be an elector of the parish for the whole of the previous 12 months
- have occupied (as owner or tenant) land or other premises in the parish during the previous 12 months
- have worked in the parish (as your principal or only place of work) for the whole of the previous 12 months
- lived in the parish or within three miles of the parish boundary

If you do become a parish councillor you will have to sign up to the Parish Council's Code of Conduct.

Meetings

Councils usually meet once a month for the council meeting, to which members of the public are also invited. Meetings may last two or three hours, depending on what's on the list of items to discuss. Some councils may also have sub-committees to deal with specific subjects, such as planning matters.

Length of service

Once elected, parish councillors sit on the council for a maximum of four years. If they then want to stay in the post they can stand for re-election.

It doesn't mean that you have to stay for four years, if you find it's not for you or you can no longer meet the commitment you can stand down.

Don't take our word for it

The best way to find out what it's like to be a parish councillor is to talk to someone who's doing it now. Participate at a parish council meeting, speak to one of the councillors and find out what they think of the job.

Hello! I'm Kim, new Vicar of Kempsford with Whelford, Castle Eaton Marston Meysey and Meysey Hampton and I just moved into the village this week. I'm here with my daughter Charlie and our black labrador Teddy. We are still trying to unpack things from within the mountain of boxes, but we have found the kettle and a bottle opener so at least the basic necessities are covered!

We are loving the beauty of the countryside around us and discovering lots of new walks with Teddy. We have also been blessed by the fish and chip van and by takeaways from The George until we figure out how to work our new oven.

It is a very strange time to move house to a new place, and to begin a new role that is usually mostly about face to face relationships – in church as we worship together, in school as a Governor supporting our teachers and support staff, in visiting people who are unwell at home or in hospital, in celebrations of love in marriages or christenings and in gathering to mourn at the end of a life well loved. The ways in which we share the love of God with one another now may have had to change, but what is amazing is to witness the resilience of love that simply morphs and adapts to find other ways round the difficulties of these days.

People do seem to be caring for their neighbours in many new and creative ways. I heard of a funeral being held in a cul de sac of sheltered accommodation so that a widow could be present at her husband's funeral, and all the residents stood outside to honour him. Similarly, a friend of mine who couldn't attend her Father's funeral was undone when the people in her close played his favourite piece of music and baked a cake left outside for her as she isolated indoors.

People may wonder where God is in these dark days; the answer is to always look for the carers. God is at work in the hands and feet of those who bring comfort, who bring food for sustenance and medicines for healing. God is in the pen of those who write a card of encouragement, in the service of those who cook and care for the needs of those who feel frail or unwell. God is love and is present wherever love is expressed. He promises never to leave us or forsake us and will bring us comfort, strength and peace if we ask Him for it.

So I look forward to when I can meet and get to know the people living in this beautiful village, to when we can meet in church to lament and mourn for those we've lost, and to celebrate together once this is behind us. Until then, I will put a blackboard outside my home The Parsonage with some jokes and riddles for children and also some bags for children containing craft activities etc. every Sunday morning for some fun while we are all indoors and can't meet.
