Problems with drains/waste water

Thames Water advised that the pumping station had blockages due to incompatible items being flushed down toilets. We are now aware that the system capacity appears to be unable to cope with the volume during heavy rainfall when storm water enters the system.

FLOOD DEFENCE

We have all become aware of climate change and the impact it can have on our lives in the future. One of the increased risks is flooding and the Environment Agency Website has some useful tips on how to protect your property and is well worth a read.

It is obviously important to try and keep water from entering your home and as an alternative to heavy sandbags there are products that can help. One of **these is 'FloodSax' which** are stored flat then self-inflate when coming into contact with water. They are reasonably inexpensive, easy to store and can be obtained at floodsax.co.uk or locally at Travis Perkins (part no 868499)



There are many other similar products available and Wickes list one on their website so it is worth shopping around.

The Parish Council is currently working with our County Councillor and other stakeholders to seek advice on how to best prevent floods and therefore protect our villages. Should the worse happen we would like to have plan in place and be in a position to help. We will keep you updated as to our progress but meanwhile stay safe and please make use of the Flood Defence information available online.



News from RAF Fairford

Following the news that the RC-135 Rivet Jointis no longer coming to RAF Fairford, the base held a virtual briefing for civic leaders, to discuss the future of the base. Although the level of growth is much smaller than originally anticipated, there will still be some growth at RAF Fairford over thecoming years.

The mission of RAF Fairford, as a Forward Operating Location for USAF aircraft, has been constant since 1990, but the intensity of the



mission has ebbed and flowed. There are plans for new hangar facilities at RAF Fairford, which will involve some construction projects over the next few years, and new permanent military posts from 2023 onwards. This is a significant investment in the base, which will come with around 300 new posts, mostly military with some new jobs available for local residents. Growth in military personnel will lead to an increase in demand for housing and schooling off base, and we are working with the relevant authorities to facilitate this.

The role of RAF Fairford as a Forward Operating Location was put into practice in March, when KC-135Air Refuelling Tankers from RAF Mildenhall operated from Fairford for a week to take part in Exercise Baltic Trident. The goal of the exercise was to strengthen Agile Combat Employment (ACE) which enables US forces to operate from locations with varying levels of capacity and support.

Capt Leo Ricotti from the 100th Air Refuelling Wing at RAF Mildenhall said "We're trying to operate in aforward location to make our movements more unpredictable for any adversary. This exercise has all our aircraft scattered all across Europe. We have a couple in the Baltics and we have some here. It's cool to be part of something new and on the leading edge of combat employment."



The commander at RAF Fairford, Lt Col Joseph"Chaps" Knothe, will be leaving in May for pastures new, after making his home here forthe past three years. Lt Col Knothe's next posting will be based in Maine, and he and his family are excited to be moving to another beautiful part of the world, from their currenthome in Cirencester. Lt Cl Knothe will be replaced by Lt Col Jeremy Stover, who will arrive in late April with his family. Following aperiod of quarantine, Lt Col Stover will take over as 420 Air Base Squadron Commander inmid-May. We will report on the Change of Command in the next issue of this Newsletter!

IN SIGHT - When out keep your pet close and make sure they have a good recall to be put back on a lead.


SEARCHABLE - To make recovery quicker make sure your pet is microchipped or tagged and keep up to date photographs to help with lost posters or social media posts.

Keep them:

- SECURE (pets are easily stolen from unsecured gardens if left unattended)
- IN SIGHT (when out and about keep them close and practice good recall)
- SEARCHABLE (to support quicker recovery if they go missing keep them microchipped, tagged and up to date photos)

Countryside Code Update May 2021

There is a new version of the Countryside code just released - search for countryside-code on the Government website.

This has been issued by Natural England and the picture attached shows what vehicles and pedestrian powered vehicles are allowed on footpaths, Bridleways, Restricted Byways and Byways open to all traffic. Check the coloured arrows to indicate what is allowed.

We have recently had a number of complaints of motorbikes using Bridleways and Restricted Byways which is a traffic offence. We have written to organised trails groups to make sure they know which Byways open to all can be used.

Walk 5: Castle Eaton towards Cricklade on the Thames Path

I was born in May and I'm sure childhood birthday parties were held outside with blue skies and fluffy cumulus clouds. But not today - it is chucking it down and windy. This walk would make a lovely "A to B". "A" would be the Red Lion at the bottom of Cricklade High St and "B" is the Red Lion Castle Eaton or visaversa. Another time perhaps.

So start as if you are coming out of the pub and turn right crossing the road to Kempsford and then go down Mill Lane (pic 1).



At the end of the lane there are a couple of cottages (in need of a bit of TLC) and go through the first gate ignoring the public footpath which goes off to the left. This walk is easy to follow as there are plenty of Thames Path signs and you are never more than 20m away from the river which is on your right hand side as we progress towards Cricklade. Pic 2 looks back to Castle Eaton and you can see the road bridge to Kempsford.

Perhaps after 10-15mins you get your first view of the Second Chance campsite and soon you will be much closer when you go around the bend. No foot bridge here which would be nice for the campers to walk up to the Red Lion.





Plenty of caravans and the odd car but no action outside I suspect they are inside enjoying a warm cuppa. Shortly afterwards I met a couple going in the London direction, and after pleasantries the bloke attempted some joke about being good to meet someone in the middle of nowhere who spoke English, so I countered with"Dr Livingstone I presume?". Shortly after I met a couple of blokes - one of them had a Fulham football club coat on so I passed on my condolences about their recent relegation from the Premier League, and then admitted that I am a West Brom supporter. I didn't count the number of fields you will go through or the number of gates (15?) but just keep going! A pleasant surprise is a small wood that you will walk through - Pic 4. Also there is a long boardwalk/bridge which crosses some water





My target was the first footbridge (Pic 6) which crosses the Thames over to Eysey (accessible from the C124). Surprisingly I couldn't see the Saxon church at Cricklade, but in my defense the visibility wasn't great today. So today this was the turning around point. On the way back you can walk around the final field a different way (which you may just be able to make out on the Strava).
