ELECTORAL REVIEW OF COTSWOLD: DRAFT RECOMMENDATIONS

Following the earlier consultation regarding the ward boundaries for Cotswold District Council, the LGBCE have announced the publication of their draft recommendations for Cotswold District Council. Summary

The aim of the electoral review is to deliver electoral equality for voters in local elections, by recommending ward boundaries that mean each councillor represents approximately the same number of electors. At present, some councillors represent many more, or fewer, electors than other elected members elsewhere in the district which means the value of your vote varies depending on where you live in Cotswold.

The review is being carried out following a request from Cotswold District Council for the Commission to consider the number of councillors elected to the council and to deliver a pattern of wards that means each ward is represented by one councillor—a 'single-member ward review'.

Cotswold District Council currently has 44 councillors. It is proposed that the council should have 34 councillors in future. The Commission believes that a council size of 34 members will ensure the council can discharge its roles and responsibilities effectively and provides for a warding pattern that meets our statutory criteria.

The draft recommendations propose that Cotswold's 34 councillors should represent 32 single-member wards and one two-member ward across the district.

What does this mean for Kempsford Parish?

We would change from the present two-member ward comprising Lechlade and Kempsford to a single-member Fairford South & Kempsford Ward.

It would include the Fairford area south of the A417 with Kempsford Parish. Also included is an area of housing on the A417 on the edge of Lechlade as well as the streets of Moorgate and The Wern. The boundary would run north along Bryworth Lane to Hambridge Lane following it to the parish boundary between Lechlade and Southrop.

It is a good safety measure to ensure that you always have a means of contacting the outside world!


