Cabinet recommends freeze on council tax, garden waste licences and car parking charges

Release date: 16 February 2017

Members of Cotswold District Council's Cabinet met today and recommended a freeze on its share of local residents' council tax payments for 2017/18, following a freeze for 2016/17, a 5% cut in 2015/16, a 3% cut in 2014/15 and a 5% reduction in 2013/14. If approved by Full Council next week, the average band D charge for District services would remain at £126.40.

The proposed freeze for 2017/18 would mean that the actual amount being charged for a Band D council tax payer will have been reduced by about £18 per year (13%) over a period stretching back to 2010/11. This would be the 16th lowest District Council charge in the Country compared with being the 63rd lowest a few years ago.

The Cabinet Members also recommended yet another freeze on parking and garden waste collection charges.

Cabinet proposes funding for more defibrillators in each ward across the District.

Release date: 16 February 2017

Cotswold District Council's Cabinet is proposing that each councillor should be provided with £2,000 to assist local fund raising for the installation of defibrillators across the Cotswolds.

The extra money should guarantee a substantial increase in the availability of defibrillators across the District and, hopefully, offset some of the problems caused by poor ambulance response times.

Cabinet Member for Health and Leisure, Cllr Alison Coggins, explains:

"We want to provide every CDC councillor with the means to improve the provision of defibrillators in their ward, and I am sure that they will be keen to work with local residents to make this happen as quickly as possible. There is hard evidence to show that defibrillators save lives and we want to ensure that many people in the Cotswolds – especially those who are elderly or vulnerable – have easy access to the equipment."

Council leader, Cllr Lynden Stowe, adds;

"I recently reviewed ambulance response times in the District over the last decade and it was clear that ambulance crews will continue to face considerable challenges in meeting target times for the highest priority emergency calls, particularly in the north. Increasing the number of defibrillators in every ward should help to alleviate this problem by providing reassurance that life-saving equipment is relatively easy to hand in the event of a medical emergency."

Dear Friends and neighbours

I'm heading off tomorrow on a slow train to Venice. Well maybe not that slow, but certainly slower than flying! I love travelling and going on holiday for me starts as soon as the front door closes. The journey to the final destination is part of the pleasure of going away. And then the romance of arriving into a city by rail. At a time when authorities throughout the country are facing the prospect of a breakdown in their community care, Fairford Hospital League of Friends has had some good news about its own home nursing service.

Friends in the Community Home Nursing, its organisation run by Celia Kennedy, has been given a good report by the national health watchdog the Care Quality Commission following an inspection of its palliative care service last summer.

The CQC rates the service safe, effective, caring, responsive and well-led.

The report draws attention to the fact that the team provides safe, effective care which enables patients to live in their own homes and comments: "People and their relatives praised the care they received... it was personalised to their needs, wishes and goals. People told us that they felt listened to."

The report added that the League of Friends of Fairford Hospital has clearly identified a need for this service in their area. It went on: "Patients told us that the staff spent time with them and were rarely rushed." The care given had a positive impact and the report went on to say: "People felt they were treated with dignity and respect. There was a caring culture."

Said the League of Friends' chairman, Graham Hewitt: "We are delighted that the work of our hard-working team has impressed the inspectors yet again. This is a difficult time for the UK's care services and we are glad that our own work in this area passes muster with the nation's experts.

He thanked Celia Kennedy for the leadership she has shown over the years.

"We are fortunate to have such excellent nurses and to live in this generous area which responds so freely whenever we ask for money. It is comforting to know the effort helps such a top-notch service as this."
