TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF 500937 HAM LANE (KEMPSFORD PARISH) COTSWOLD DISTRICT

Gloucestershire County Council intend to make an order under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (as amended) to temporarily close part of the C500937 Ham Lane outside the property known as Glebe Acres for a distance of approximately 30 metres.




It was a bitterly cold morning and we were overcome with pride for Mummy at how many people turned out. A massive thank you to you all

DEADLINE LOOMS FOR EU NATIONALS TO GET HELP WITH EUSS

Following the UK's departure from the EU, the UK government launched the EU Settlement Scheme (EUSS). The deadline for applications is 30.6.21. Stroud and Cotswolds Citizens Advice is helping EU nationals to understand the scheme and how to apply. It can provide help EU nationals to apply until 31 March.

The EUSS allows those EU nationals resident in the UK by 31.12.20 to apply for settled or pre-settled status. Any EU nationals who fail to apply by the deadline risk losing their right to live, work and study in the UK. They could also lose access to public funds, pensions and the opportunity to apply for British citizenship.

Chief Officer, Alison Gibbon said "EU nationals play an important part in the economy and public services of the Stroud and Cotswolds particularly in healthcare, agriculture and industry. It's vital that citizens of EU countries understand their rights and obligations under the scheme. Citizens Advice can help EU nationals, particularly those who may be digitally excluded or lack the necessary language skills to secure their status. If you need help, please contact us before 31 March."

Did you check, switch and save this winter?

This winter, Citizens Advice in partnership with the Energy Saving Trust ran a UK campaign for three months to help people cut their energy bills and access specialist energy saving advice.

If you didn't see the digital campaign (we know not everyone uses social media) there are three actions to take:

- 1. **Check** that you're not paying too much for your energy, and find out whether you're eligible for discounts, grants or other financial support.
- 2. **Switch** your energy tariff or supplier to make sure you're getting the best deal. This can save people lots of money on their energy bills.
- 3. **Save** money by making your home more energy efficient. Making small changes can save you money and help the environment. For example, fitting your hot water cylinder with an insulating jacket will save you £20 a year in heating costs and 150kg of carbon dioxide emissions.

If you haven't **checked, switched and saved** this winter and would like help to do so please get in touch. Your gas, electricity and water bills do not have to be worrying issues.

Walk 2: Towards Lechlade from Hannington Wick

Distance: 3.9 mi Elevation: 8ft Time: 1:08:4



We're going "national" with the second walk – but in February you probably won't see a soul. This is the Thames Path going east towards Lechlade (and London!). For this I started by driving down to Hannington Wick and parked on the bend perhaps 200m after the Thames bridge (pic1). Walk down the short tarmaced road and then fork right at the end. You are going to go through several fields and wooded ar-





eas before you get alongside the Thames. Being the Thames Path the
sign posting will help so that it is impossible to
get lost! Pic 2 shows the typical terrain – lots
of birds singing and flying about. The walk
here feels lovely and remote – no houses or
cars in sight. For one of the fields you walk

down the middle – probably once a hedgerow. Last growing season this

was maize so in the autumn it was a bit like walking through a tunnel without a roof. At the end of this there is a boardwalk which at this time of the year is very useful (pic3).



You then come to the only junction – again well signposted (pic4). The old route would have taken you to the right to Inglesham village, and then you had to walk along the A361 before rejoining the Thames. Now the much better new route forks left, and although it is still not by the Thames it is at least roadfree. The route is quite wet as



pic 4 implies, so in February wellies or boots are a good idea. Next walk along a fenced path to a bridge and at last you are along-side the Thames (pic5). But what is this sign asking you to keep off the airfield? Bet not many of you know about "Inglesham Airport"



– not that I have ever seen a plane there. Now you will have the Thames on your left and the airfield on your right and good open views ahead towards Dudgrove. You will see the outline of the "runway" on the Strava map (and thanks BTW to those who joined the Kempsford -WOTM club).

Today to keep the walk around the one hour mark, I turned round at the next bridge where a couple of boats are moored (pic6) and then walked back to the car. When things are back to normal

you can carry on a bit further to see the Inglesham church – much loved by William Morris, and then you could carry on to Lechlade for a well earned pint. This would add ~1.5 miles so having another car or someone to pick you up in Lechlade would be useful.
