# Flood Defence

Over the last month or so we have seen huge amounts of rainfall and whilst our local fields were saturated and completely covered in water we narrowly escaped intrusion into any homes. That said the Thames at Castle Eaton was as high as many can remember so we must remain vigilant.

On average the UK has an average rainfall of about 46 inches and the Met Office advise this should remain consistent. However, climate change could see extended dry periods followed by huge amounts of rain in a very short time. We could see little rain for extended periods then 2 months worth in a week so the flood risk increases as lots of water falls on hard ground. We have all just witnessed it!

Our villages are surrounded by the River Coln on one side and the River Thames on the other, in the middle are a huge airbase and numerous quarries that have to be drained. The Parish Council works hard will all stakeholders, including Thames Water & the Environment Agency, to ensure adequate drainage is in place. That said we all have a responsibility to do our bit and avoid excess surface water which eventually penetrates and becomes groundwater.

If not managed the groundwater will rise with the potential to cause serious flooding to you and your neighbours. The advice form the Environment Agency is prevention as the consequence of a flooded home is awful for anybody. Roofs can discharge 600 gallons of water an hour and to put this into context for the 500 or so homes around our villages this could be 300,000 gallons an hour! We would again urge everybody to ensure gutters and drains are free of any blockage so water is free to drain properly, otherwise this impacts everybody. Also, we would remind everybody that Costswold District Council do not provide sandbags but easy to store 'Floodsax' are available online and from several local stockists including Screwfix and Wickes. Be prepared!

Spring is in the air and so much new life is beginning to emerge in the hedgerows and fields at last. Catkins always lift my spirits, swaying in time with the breeze. It's a time for spring cleaning; I remember helping my grandmother beat the 'carpets' – rugs, really – on the washing line in the back garden, and turn out cupboards to get the house ready for Easter.

This instinct to cleanliness and new life chimes with the arrival of Lent, when we clean out our internal 'cupboards' and throw out behaviours and habits that are not helpful to us, making room for new perspectives and priorities in our lives. This prepares our hearts for Eastertide, when Jesus died on the cross, taking all our old bad habits down into the grave with him. At the Resurrection when he rose again to new life, he forgave us and opened a new and living way for us to walk with him, set free of our old baggage and mistakes.

This cycle of letting go of our old ways and making room in our homes and hearts for newness is a part of the natural circle of life upon which the church year is based. Everything dies, and although that can cause us pain, new life always follows—we see it in nature and in ourselves. At church, we travel this journey into new life together, by gathering for Lent lunches and a time of reflection and sharing some readings. This year these will take place as follows:
