ANNUAL PARISH MEETING

Originally the meeting was scheduled for early April, but due to the high number of Covid cases in the area at that time it was cancelled.

RE-DEVELOPMENT OF OAKLEY FLATS & CROSS TREE CRESCENT

Speller Metcalfe will be undertaking the construction of 27 new dwellings in Cross Tree Crescent and Oakley Flats on behalf of Bromford Housing Association.

The first phase of the works (Oakley Flats) was due to commence on 19th April 2022 for a period of around 42 weeks with a predicted completion date of 2nd February 2023. Phase 2, Cross Tree Crescent, will commence in March 2023

COTSWOLD COGFEST BIKE RIDE

Cotswold Cogfest bike ride is happening again this year on Sunday 22nd May. The riders will be coming through Kempsford again in small groups probably between 10 - 11:30am. They will be coming from Hannington Wick and heading towards Whelford.

A feed station table will be set up near the church and the area left litter free and tidy after.

TRAFFIC, ROADS & SPEEDING


Traffic, speeding and road conditions is understandably the topic of most complaints received by the Parish Council.

We have been working on a number of things to get improvements including-

AutoSpeedWatch Devices

AutoSpeedWatch automatically records speeding vehicles as an aid to Community Speed Watch (CSW) schemes.

It is NOT an enforcement or ANPR camera; It does not issue fines or directly penalise a speeding motorist. It's like having a CSW team at the roadside but for longer hours and without getting cold and hungry! Unlike "Yellow box" enforcement cameras,



AutoSpeedWatch distinguishes between vehicles that are persistently or particularly fast, and those vehicles where the driver has made an occasional mistake. This allows the police to prioritise their resources against the worst drivers.

Community Speedwatch deterrence, but easier and more effective...

No need for people at the roadside, no risk of being struck, no verbal or physical abuse. All the CSW team need to do is verify the logs it creates using a browser at home or anywhere else, making Community SpeedWatch easier, safer, and more effective. The data is collated and prioritised by severity into specific intelligence for police. This allows them to identify and take further action as they deem appropriate; often by writing to the registered keeper in the first instance, but it also allows them to deploy the Speed Enforcement Units at specific places and times in order to catch and fine the worst speeders.


The system is currently being trialled in two Parishes within Gloucestershire and we are hoping that it will soon be given approval by Gloucestershire Police and Highways for wider use within the County. The Parish Council has included a budget to purchase a couple of the devices as soon as they become available.


It is worth noting that fixed, community owned, speed detecting cameras will become an optional part of the CSW initiative and that camera sites are, as we currently understand it, unlikely to be approved unless a community has an established CSW program in place or has other data confirming speeding as the means to justify the installation of a camera.

SPEED & TRAFFIC SURVEYS

We recently paid for two surveys to be carried out, one at Whelford and the other at Top Road, Kempsford. A summary of the results follows.

Not only will the data provide evidence to justify our need for devices such as the AutoSpeedWatch, but hopefully increase visits by the Police Speed Camera Enforcement Team. Previous visits have proved successful with 35 offenders caught (including locals!) within a couple of hours.

CONDITION OF ROADS

Councillors recently met with our local Gloucestershire Highways Manager to show him issues within the Parish.

The C124 from Kempsford to Latton is in a very poor condition due to the high number of gravel and other lorries using it. The road changes County boundary 4 times between Gloucestershire and Wiltshire and we continue to press for a more joined up approach to maintaining it.

With two new quarry planning applications currently being considered, we have requested contributions to improvement and maintenance of these local roads as a condition of any new permissions granted.

As with all things, the more responses and reports of potholes etc it raises the importance of them. Therefore we would encourage residents to report any issues directly to Highways. Contact details for both Gloucestershire and Wiltshire are on the back page of this newsletter. Both also have on-line reporting facilities.

Vicar's Letter May 2022

We live in sobering times, as Russia's invasion of Ukraine enters its third month. Our hopes that it would be over soon, or was merely a show of force, have been dashed as atrocities continue to be broadcast on our tv screens.

Our villages and school community responded quickly and some have registered to take Ukrainians into their homes. Sadly, the systems appear to work slowly and of the 40,000 visas granted, only 6,600 Ukrainian refugees have so far arrived in the country. Meanwhile, the cost of living crisis continues as fuel and food costs rise sharply, and will no doubt impact daily life for many people here in our villages. Life feels hard, and as though it could get harder. What can we do?

Strengthen our community ties

If we come together, we can overcome struggles together. Two heads are always better than one, and we have people with all kinds of life experience in our villages. By sharing what we know and have, we will all benefit. Research shows that being active in a community group creates belonging and is good for our physical and mental wellbeing, and the Bible tells us we were not made to be alone. For myself, I know being in groups and having good friendships is so important for my wellbeing.




