

Dear Friends and Neighbours

"I've remembered what I'd forgotten!" said the elderly gentleman - with a mixture of delight and relief - to the manager of the sheltered housing scheme whom I was visiting a few years ago. He then told her what he had meant to tell her a little time before.

I know that I can be forgetful but I was upbraided in the summer by being reminded of something that I had forgotten.

I happened to be visiting London and between engagements had some 'time to kill' and thought I would visit the Guard's Museum, which was nearby. As I idly wandered around, a wear-torn wooden cross caught my eye. It had the name 'Sean Birchall' written on it. And I remembered something that I'd forgotten...

Sean had been the son of that sheltered housing manager – Maureen. He had been killed on duty in Afghanistan in June 2009, leaving a lovely wife and little boy. His family were devastated, yet so proud of this brave and handsome man in the prime of his life with good prospects ahead of him.

It's not possible to carry all of our memories at the forefront of our minds all the time – thankfully. But there are people whom we knew and loved and who touched our lives; and it's good to remember them from time to time.

This unexpected event helped me to appreciate the fact that we have earmarked a day for Remembrance – when we are reminded of those whose lives have been lost for our freedom and our country. In the church calendar All Soul's Day is another day when we remember departed loved ones; and at the Last Supper Jesus understood that doing something helps us to remember - 'Do this in remembrance of me'.

I hope you too will remember someone whom you had forgotten; or something you had forgotten about a loved one.

Dear John

With the departure of the Reverend Tim Hastie-Smith to take up a new post as Team Vicar at Bibury, Barnsley and Winson, a vacancy came about at Kempsford and Whelford.

It is normal practice in the Church of England for a period of time to elapse between the former vicar leaving and a new one being appointed and starting in post.

It is our clear expectation that we will in due course be appointing a replacement Team Vicar (House for Duty) who will occupy the Parsonage at Kempsford.

The appointment of a new priest will take some time, as we need to review the whole of the clergy staffing levels across the South Cotswolds Team Ministry and how we allocated responsibilities.

This review is now underway and as part of it we will be consulting of course with your wardens. I would expect the review to be reporting to the Diocesan Mission and Pastoral Group on 28 January2016.

In the meantime, Sunday services are being covered by a team of clergy who are leading services on a regular basis – so that they are well known by the congregation. The Team Curate – the Revd Lynn Hayler – has been appointed as a Foundation Governor at the School and is taking part in school assemblies and activities. The Team Rector, who has overall responsibility for the leadership of the parish is working with the PCC to ensure the day-to-day needs of the parish are being addressed.

I hope you will support your Churchwardens and PCC during this time of transition.

Police Circulars

Darker Nights - Operation Switch



The police will be launching their Darker Nights Operation Switch campaign on 23rd October to remind communities of the importance of leaving a light on to make their home look occupied. The police, in conjunction with Crimestoppers, will be delivering free light switches to the more vulnerable locations across the county. Please remind your streets to use timer switches to turn on lights and generally make their properties look occupied especially when coming home from work to a dark home.

There will be more information to follow and dates when the Neighbourhood Engagement Vehicle is visiting your location. Please ask your members to consider coming along and joining in.

Fuel Theft

Many rural and heritage home owners use oil tanks to heat their homes, makes this an attractive proportion for thieves. Thefts vary from small amounts being stolen, to the whole tank being drained. Methods used by the thieves can be very basic, including drilling holes in the side of the tank through to extractor pumps and the use of large holding tanks on articulated lorries. The most effective ways to deter criminals from targeting an external oil tank are to:

- Locate the tank in a position where it can be seen from the property, but not from the road.
- Install movement activated security lighting. But if there is no increased chance of criminal activity being seen, do not install new lights as these may assist the thief
- Make sure your boundary walls and fences are suitable and lock driveway access gates at night and when the premises are unattended
- Site the tank within a locked, well ventilated and detached out building.
- Conceal the location of the tank use hedging, fencing or walling.
- Defensive planting is nature's way of helping to reduce crime. Thieves will be reluctant to force their way
 through or over prickly vegetation. Defensive planting around the tank could provide an effective and
 decorative barrier.
- Consider buying an electronic tank gauge, which you can read from inside your property, this will also set off an alarm should there be a sudden drop in oil level caused by a leak or theft.
- Larger properties should consider installing monitored CCTV.

Parish Council News

The children's play area behind the village hall is being thoughtlessly abused by some older children/young adults. Recent incidents have included bottles being smashed leaving broken glass, experiments with burning various items, the inevitable high jinks with wrapping swings around their chains, spent fireworks (including the wire sparklers), cigarette detritus (some looking curiously drug related) and a significant increase in litter generally.

It would be nice if parents could allow their toddlers in without having to carry out a safety check beforehand and make the swings useable.

Although the play area is not really intended for older children it is perfectly understandable, and acceptable, for them to use it as a "hang out". Individually the children are invariably quite sensible but unfortunately when they gather together they adopt this thoughtlessness. Could we therefore ask the parents of older children to just enquire that their golden eyed darlings are not acting in this thoughtless manner.

DOG FOULING

Dog fouling continues to be a big problem in Kempsford. Please find below the content of a note sent to the Parish Council from a Kempsford resident -

HELP— I am sending a desperate plea to the dog owners(s) who allow their dog(s) to continually foul on my lawn. Dogs should be on a lead controlled by their owner. I try and work very hard to keep my garden clean and tidy. I am partially disabled, live alone and find it very difficult.

We encourage people to report instances to Cotswold District Council. Complaints will be investigated and offenders will be prosecuted. An example of this was published in a recent edition of the 'Ripples' Magazine—

'A Fairford person has been issued with a Fixed Penalty Notice for allowing their dog to foul the public highway and not clearing it up. Evidence was provided by public-spirited members of the community, who have been guaranteed anonymity. Hopefully, more people will now stand up and be counted to combat this anti-social behaviour and more dog owners will realise that people in Fairford do not want to see dog mess on public areas.

Dog Waste Bins

There is a number of dog waste bins in Kempsford. The Parish Council will be producing a map showing the location of these for publication in a future newsletter.

The waste bins are emptied weekly, but if you do notice an overflowing bin it can be reported through the Cotswold District Council website, and it will be emptied within 24hrs —

Manor Farm Quarry

Press Release Jobcentre Plus to be co-located with Council at Trinity Road

Release date: 7 October 2015

The Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) has given the go-ahead for Cirencester's Jobcentre Plus services to be co-located with Cotswold District Council at the latter's Trinity Road headquarters.

The co-location – which is expected to take place early in 2016 - will allow both organisations to provide a more joined up face-to-face service for customers. By working more closely together as key partners, they will also save on overheads and reduce costs to the taxpayer.

The move fits very well with the Government's programme of welfare reform and service transformation and will further support the delivery of Universal Credit which went live in Cotswold district from May 2015.

It is anticipated that all the staff who currently work at the Cirencester Jobcentre will relocate to Trinity Road and will continue to deliver the same range of services. When the move is completed, the existing Jobcentre in Southway, Cirencester will close.

Nick Browning, the Jobcentre Plus District Manager, comments:

"The relocation of our Jobcentre to the Cotswold District Council offices in Cirencester presents us with an exciting opportunity to work alongside a key local partner in delivering improved services to people in the area, and will support the future delivery of Universal Credit to Cotswold customers."

CDC Leader Cllr Lynden Stowe, adds:

"We have been in discussions with the DWP about this co-location for some time and I am grateful to everyone who has been involved in making this possible. As well as enabling co-located service delivery in Cirencester for the first time, all taxpayers should be pleased to hear that we will be making best use of excess office accommodation at Trinity Road and reducing both our running costs."



News from RAF Fairford – October 2015

There will be an increase in airfield activity at RAF Fairford over the coming weeks, starting on Thursday 22 October.

A small number of aircraft from RAF Brize Norton will be using the airfield at RAF Fairford, due to a fuel storage tank being temporarily out of action at RAF Brize Norton. Aircraft operations will take place only during normal operating hours at RAF Fairford.

An MoD Spokesperson said:

"RAF Brize Norton is very grateful to the US Air Force at RAF Fairford for allowing some operations on a short term basis, whilst the Brize Norton fuels system is undergoing essential maintenance."

RAF Fairford is home to the USAF 420th Air Base Squadron, which is part of the 501st Combat Support Wing at RAF Alconbury in Cambridgeshire. The base is maintained in a ready, "lean status" by a civilian workforce who are responsible for all daily tasks and contingency preparations. The main mission at RAF Fairford is to be ready to receive a deployment of aircraft and personnel with 48 hours' notice, both for real-world scenarios and for training.

Gloucestershire Wildlife Trust Alan Sumnall – Cotswold Water Park Reserves Manager

Autumn is fast approaching and for many animals, that means making provisions for the coming winter months as food supplies will diminish.



There are various strategies for different animals; one method which some mammals use is hibernation. This refers to extended periods of 'sleep' characterised with a reduced heart rate, slow breathing, and lower body temperature which reduces metabolism. This means that a mammal does not need to eat as often and reduces the need to forage for food in times when supplies are low and weather is detrimental.

One of our most famous animals to do so in the UK is the Hedgehog. Autumn is a vitally important time as individuals will be stocking up on food to put on fat reserves; if an individual does not attain enough reserves, unfortunately, they might not survive through hibernation. This is a common fatality in juvenile hedgehogs, especially those born late in the year. Hedgehogs that don't gather enough food may wake from hibernation and start foraging, particularly during warmer periods.

Hedgehogs used to be a familiar site in many gardens, but have drastically declined by 95% since the 1950's. It is a very realistic thought that Hedgehogs may not be around by 2050. There are many reasons for this decline in both the wider countryside and our gardens including intensive agriculture, loss of hedgerows, use of pesticides (reducing the amount of prey), smaller and tidier gardens with fencing that prevents hedgehogs moving between suitable gardens and habitats. Furthermore, an ever increasing number of new developments and roads cause already small populations to become isolated, and many are killed by road traffic.

The site of a hedgehog wandering around a garden or neighbourhood brings back fond memories for many of us; however can you remember when you last had the pleasure of seeing a hedgehog? The good news is there are many things we can do to help Hedgehogs. Here are a few suggestions: Provide food and water, particularly during the winter. If you have a hedgehog in your garden cat food is good but if you have a lot of cats in your area it might be best to put out meal worms. Make sure there is water available for all wildlife, and ensure to break any ice if it freezes If you have a pond in your garden make sure it has shallow or stepped sides to ensure that any wildlife that falls in can climb out. Hedgehogs easily drown in ponds

Make a small hole in your garden fence to allow hedgehogs to move between suitable areas Leave a section your garden 'wild'. This will allow for increased foraging for prey; you could also create a habitat pile with cut vegetation which will increase hibernation areas If you burn cut vegetation in your garden during the autumn or winter, ensure you check for hedgehogs or other wildlife first. This can be done by moving the material to another site so that any wildlife will be disturbed and move off, and any animals hibernating will be found. Reduce the speed in your car during nocturnal hours, especially in areas where you have seen Hedgehogs, or travelling through small country lanes

The Gloucestershire Wildlife Trust has just launched a campaign asking members of the public to record any hedgehog sightings (dead or alive). This data will help us to identify remaining populations within the County and how we can help protect them. If you would like to report a Hedgehog sighting, please use the web address below:
