

Dear Friends,

October is a long dark month that culminates in the celebration of the Feast of All Hallows (All Saints) on 1st November. However it is All Hallows Eve (Better known as Halloween) that has caught the imagination as the dark end point of October. Yet this focus on darkness and evil seems a bit odd when you consider that All Hallows is a celebration of lives of the saints (a word in Christian understanding which covers All believers)As someone once put it, 'saints are like stained glass windows (Where you often find images of saints) the light comes in through them' Saints are people who let the light in. 2nd November celebrates All Souls, in other words all life, all living creatures, and particularly the recently departed!

Of course it is the recollection of death and a remembrance of judgement that can stir up images of graveyards and wickedness, but even there, it seems a strange and sad perversion. A graveyard, whilst certainly a place of loss, and the grief that accompanies loss, is also a place that pays tribute to, and celebrates the lives of those who have gone before us. Around Saint Mary's there are over a 1,000 years' worth of villagers who have gone before us. We are the 'next link in the chain of life. In the Churchyard we are surrounded by friends and family (and as Bill Bryson points out, quite a lot of them, which is why the ground around an old church is always raised!)

So this Halloween we celebrate life and light

On **Friday 31**st **October at 6:30pm** there will be an **All Souls Service** where we remember our beloved departed with a simple Eucharist, and where names of the recently departed are read out and remembered.

On Sunday 2nd November we have two 'Light Parties' in the Church. From 2:30-3:30 there is one for children aged 0-7 with their families, and from 5:30-6:30pm there is one for children aged 8-14 with games, barbecue and fireworks



New Telecare options

Gloucestershire Telecare is offering residents greater choice and flexibility over their care options than ever before, and we need you to help spread the word.



Telecare can help older people and people with physical disabilities, memory problems, learning disabilities and mental health conditions stay safe and independent at home.

They do this by providing equipment that helps detect potential emergencies in the home, such as falls, wandering, medication mismanagement, fire, flooding and carbon monoxide and gas leaks. This provides great reassurance and peace of mind to families and carers.

Now Telecare have a new **self-help website** that will help more people find and choose personal Telecare equipment which can delay the need for domiciliary home or residential care.

The new site also gives free, professional, independent advice on the types of Telecare equipment that could help people manage tasks at home more easily and independently. Advisors look at what people need extra support with and build a fully personalised Telecare solution for what is needed in their own home.

For the first time the website offers the opportunity for people to purchase Telecare equipment privately, meaning the service is now available for everyone whether they are eligible for social services support or not.

The website also offers the option to send information to Gloucestershire Telecare to see whether someone is eligible for a free Telecare service.

More about Telecare

- Telecare equipment can be programmed to call a 24 hour monitoring centre, where trained operators can help call for help if needed.
- Stand alone equipment is also available, including things like personal memo reminders, which can help people manage day to day tasks in their own homes.
- Telecare is discreet, simple to use and can be adapted to meet people's personal needs.

As you know, I am the Village Agent covering your area and my role is to provide information, support and practical help for the over 50s in the community. And in that capacity I wished to remind you all about Healthwatch, your local independent champion for health and social care.

Healthwatch Gloucestershire needs your views!

For the past 18 months Healthwatch has been out and about in Gloucestershire asking local people to share their health and social care experiences good and bad. The more of these we can hear about, the better commissioners and providers of services can understand what patients actually need and want. The three areas we are now focused on are hospital discharge, patient transport services and podiatry and for each we have set up a task group. We would like to hear from people with experiences relating to any of the topic areas below.

Hospital Discharge

We are keen to hear from people who have been, or know someone who has been discharged from hospital to home, residential/nursing care or sheltered accommodation in the past 12 months. The group is focusing on a number of issues, including provision of services following discharge (e.g. community physiotherapy) experiences of frail older people, those with learning disabilities and mental health problems, including dementia.

RAF Fairford Update

RAF Fairford is home to the USAF 420th Air Base Squadron, which is part of the 501st Combat Support Wing based at RAF Alconbury in Cambridgeshire. The base is maintained in a ready, "warm status" by a civilian workforce who are responsible for all daily tasks and contingency preparations.

There are no aircraft permanently stationed at RAF Fairford, and the main mission of the base is to be ready to receive a deployment of aircraft and personnel with 48 hours' notice, both for real-world scenarios and for training exercises.

The base has been busy over the last few months, with a major training event for bomber aircraft in June, the Royal International Air Tattoo in July, and an emergency services exercise in September. And nobody could have missed the excitement when President Obama transited through RAF Fairford on Air Force One, on his way to and from the NATO Summit in Wales, in early September!

The base should be back to routine operations over the winter, and we are not, at this time, expecting any major exercises or activity over the next few months.




