Dear Friends and Neighbours

At the start of October the harvest is all but over. Haymaking was a bit later this year and our local farmers were bringing in their hay bales at the end of July; and then combine harvesters were in the fields in August and September doing their work, whilst dodging the showers.

Whilst I don't always appreciate being held-up behind large agricultural vehicles when driving on narrow lanes, I do remind myself that if it were not for our farmers, here and abroad, we would not have food on our tables – it doesn't simply appear in supermarkets by magic! And learning a little patience is not necessarily a bad thing...

Farmers and gardeners do need to be patient – waiting from the time the seeds are sown to germination; waiting for the crops to mature and survive pests, diseases and the weather; waiting for the crops to ripen ready for harvest – all takes time and patience.

The Bible has much to say about farming, the harvest and patience. St James wrote: 'Consider the farmers who patiently wait for the rains in the autumn and in the spring. They eagerly look for the valuable harvest to ripen' (James 5:7). St Paul tells us that love is – amongst other things – patient (1 Corinthians 13). Patience, we are told, is a virtue.

I am not always virtuous, and not always very patient. I am at the risk of making that prayer: '*God, make me patient – NOW!*'

In recent weeks many people needed to wait - farmers for the right weather; students for exam results; parents for the start of a new term! Whatever it is that we are waiting for – may we learn to be more patient, with ourselves and with each other.

Lakes by Yoo donate to local charities

On 11th August, Lakes by Yoo donated £4,000 to two local charities; the Newfoundland Friends and the Lechlade and District Lions. The charities each received £2,000 and already have exciting plans for the donations.

The Lechlade and District Lions, a member of Lions Clubs International, will put the money towards a new community bus with disabled access. The club, which was chartered in 1978 to help in the local community and further afield where possible, runs a number of activities in the local area helping young people and senior citizens.

John Sheffield, Chair of Lechlade and District Lions' Fundraising Committee said:

"Lechlade and District Lions is delighted to have received the donation from the Lakes by Yoo. It will help considerably with the charity work we support and will particularly help with the commissioning of a new community bus, which is expected in the next few months."

Newfound Friends was formed in the Cotswolds 26 years ago in 1989, with the objective of using the skills of the Newfoundland Dog to raise money for children's charities. The group is now focused on training Newfoundland dogs and people in lifesaving skills and enhancing the lives of disabled adults and children through interaction with the dogs.

In recent months the Newfoundland dogs have plunged into harbours to demonstrate their rescuing skills in water, provided companionship at children's hospices and hospitals, and helped with fundraising for other charities.

Talking about the two charities, John Hitchcox Lakes by Yoo Founder said:

"I am delighted that the Lakes by yoo is able to support these two fantastic charities. Both charities, in their own way, make a significant difference to the lives of people living locally. It was pleasure to learn more about each of their work and their plans for the future."

Free courses

to help with stress, anxiety, low self-esteem, sleep problems and other similar issues are all available through the NHS.

The courses are being provided by the county's Let's Talk service and are based on Cognitive Behavioural Therapy (CBT).

Alex Burrage, of Let's Talk, said: "One in four of us will be experiencing a mental health condition at any given time. Our courses are all held in community venues, and some are held during the day time while others are held in the evenings, so there is usually a course to suit everyone's needs.

"They are educational in nature and there's no need to share personal information or even speak in front of other people on the course, unless you want to.

"We've helped thousands of people overcome the most common mental health problems we can all experience from time to time, and the feedback we get from people who complete our courses is fantastic. Many people say they have changed their lives."

Let's Talk is an Improving Access to Psychological Therapies service provided by ²gether NHS Foundation Trust.

As well as courses, Let's Talk also provides therapy over the phone as well as face-to-face. There are also guided self-help books you can access.
