Activity at RAF Fairford

Three B-52 Stratofortress aircraft, 300 Airmen and support equipment have recently arrived to RAF Fairford, to conduct theatre integration and training. The aircraft and personnel have come from the 2nd Bomb Wing located at Barksdale Air Force Base in Louisiana. During their time at RAF Fairford, they will conduct flight operations and integration to improve bomber interoperability, training alongside allied nations and joint partners.

RAF Fairford serves as the U.S. Air Forces in Europe's forward operating location for bombers. The strong and strategic relationship between the United States and the United Kingdom ensures a collective defense posture that is ready and prepared to respond to and support global operations. These specific events enable theatre integration and training with U.S. joint partners, allied nations and other U.S. Air Force units, which enhances global bomber interoperability.

While there will be a temporary increase in noise levels, personnel and activity at RAF Fairford over the next several weeks, the U.S. Air Force will respect local quiet hours and minimize impacts to the surrounding community as much as possible, while meeting operational requirements. The U.S. Air Force is grateful for the hospitality of the local community and the U.K. as hosts.

The most recent Ample Strike exercise involved two B-1B Lancer aircraft from the 7th Bomb Wing and two B-52 Stratofortress from the 307th Bomb Wing, Air Force Reserve Command. Exercise Ample Strike 2017 was a Czech Republic led multi-National exercise involving 19 participants, aimed at increasing proficiency and improving standardization and interoperability across NATO allies and partners. Participating nations included Belgium, Canada, Croatia, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Hungary, Italy, Latvia, Lithuania, Netherlands, Poland, Slovenia, Slovakia, United Kingdom and United States. The U.S. Air Force's forward presence in Europe allows them to work with allies and partners to develop and improve ready air forces capable of maintaining regional security.

Himalayan Balsam

Himalayan balsam (*Impatiens glandulifera*), invasive in many parts of the Cotswolds, is now subject to strict controls.

An update to the EU Regulation on Invasive Alien Species has named an additional nine plants and Himalayan Balsam is one. All plant species listed in the Regulation are subject to strict control measures. These include a ban on keeping, growing, cultivating, transporting, trading and releasing the species into the wider environment. These measures apply to individuals as well as to organisations and businesses.

The plant with its pink flowers and lance shaped leaves can be seen growing in increasing numbers alongside our roads, rivers and fields. It is an attractive plant in its way and not unremarkable. When the seed pods are dry they burst and shoot the seeds some distance from the parent plant. It is this that enables it to colonise an area so quickly. If a shoot is broken off, the plant quickly grows two shoots to replace the one. This vigour is why it is so invasive and where it grows it is literally smothering all, but the toughest of our native plants.

Gardeners and landowners who already have the balsam (and any of the other species*) on their land are not at risk of prosecution for possession as the Regulation is not retrospective. However, they will have to meet the other requirements to ensure they control the species on their property and do not allow it to spread.

New funding available for local groups in Gloucestershire!



The People's Health Trust have launched their 'Active Communities Grant Programme' in Gloucestershire.

Local groups and organisations with ideas of how they can make their communities an even better place to live are now invited to apply for funding to turn their ideas into reality.

Using money raised by 'HealthTotal' through The Health Lottery, People's Health Trust is looking to invest in projects that support people living in the most disadvantaged neighbourhoods or communities in Gloucestershire. To find out whether a project is eligible visit: https://www.peopleshealthtrust.org.uk/apply-for-funding. Applications from Cheltenham, Gloucester and the Forest of Dean areas are particularly welcomed.

Active Communities is a funding programme for not-for-profit groups with an income of less than £350,000 a year, or an average of £350,000 over two years, seeking investment of between £5,000 and £50,000 for projects lasting up to two years.

Projects could be almost anything that encourages strong connections between people, and that help people to make their communities or neighbourhoods even better places to grow, live, work and age. There are two strands:

They are looking for small and local projects, 'neighbourhood based projects' - genuinely designed and run by local people. By small, they mean just a small group of people on an estate, in a few streets or villages.

They are also looking for great ideas from 'communities of interest'. By this they mean a group of people who have something in common and wish to come together to address something that is important to them. These ideas could be based in one neighbourhood, or cover a wider area.

John Hume, Chief Executive, People's Health Trust, says: "We're looking to support ideas designed and run by local people which help create even stronger links and ties within communities. Whether it's a women's volunteering group run by and for Bengali women; a computer skills support group run for and by older people; support for local people to become community organisers; or young people living with mental ill-health wishing to

address access to work issues or discrimination, we're interested to hear about it". There is a two stage application process that begins with a short online form. There's step by step guidance to help you along the way.
