#### Introduction from your local Neighbourhood Policing Team

Excessive or inappropriate speeding is dangerous and is responsible for many unnecessary injuries and collisions. It is a serious traffic offence which affects the quality of life of many communities throughout Gloucestershire.

Reducing excessive and inappropriate speed is a priority for Gloucestershire police. We use a wide range of education, enforcement and publicity programmes to address the issue. Our Community Speedwatch (CSW) initiative is one of these. Similar schemes are operated throughout the UK.

These local schemes are established where communities raise speeding as a concern through their local neighbourhood team or local council. They enable local people to play an active role in improving their community and provide a valuable deterrent to people driving irresponsibly.

#### How does Community Speedwatch work?

At specified safe locations, volunteers monitor the speed of passing vehicles with a hand-held speed detection device. Speeding vehicles' details are recorded on a log sheet, including the names and signatures of the volunteers monitoring speeds, the make/model and registration number of the vehicle and the speed recorded by the hand-held device.

Log sheets are then submitted to the local neighbourhood policing team (preferably within seven days) who may arrange for warning letters to be sent to the registered keepers with advice on safer driving.

As we are at the changing of the season, where summer gives way to Autumn in the church we are celebrating Harvest. As I help out at several other churches beyond those of Kempsford and Whelford I get to celebrate numerous Harvests, which is apt as is are certainly more than one in the farming world. I gave a talk about harvesting various crops when I worked on a farm in the early nineties as a student at Kempsford school recently, and it reminded me forcefully of how hard those in agriculture work and how grateful to them we should be beyond an annual church celebration.

I was surprised when I first learnt that church Harvest celebrations only really began in the 19<sup>th</sup> Century. Less so when it became apparent they seemed to begin in Cornwall though. It was most likely an attempt to reign in the celebrations of the locals by making it more formal. Even today in Cornwall the local saint, St Pirran, is celebrated mainly in the pubs and I can imagine Victorian clergy being concerned by harvest being more about enjoying certain produce than thanking God for it.

It's important to thank people for their work. Most of us are courteous, and say thank you as a matter of course, but every once in a while it's good to make a little more effort. In the Hindu/Buddhist tradition there is a special day to thank teachers called Guru Purnima. I had never heard of it until the day Dev Patel handed me a card thanking me for being his RE teacher. Secondary school teachers tend to get much less contact with individual pupils and parents, and so receive less in the way of direct thanks. I was so touched by this simple card and it's place in my memorabilia box helps remind me to be more clearly thankful to those who are around me.

As we thank God for the Harvest, and those farmers who bring it in having tended to it all year round, let us remember the many others in our lives. Those whose work is often less noticed or appreciated, and remember to thank them too.
