

October 2021

In recent weeks I'm sure we've all seen the tractors, trailers and combines going up and down the lanes of our villages, bringing in the harvest. The bales of hay are efficiently cut, rolled and transported. Farmers are out late at night, working in the dark by tractor headlights to get the job done. If you've watched Clarkson's Farm, filmed fairly near to us in Oxfordshire, you'll know all about the long hours and the perilous profits of some UK farmers. We owe our local farmers a debt of gratitude, as they grow food and take care of livestock, aswell as maintaining hedgerows and footpaths.

The Bible is full of stories about agriculture, and in particular planting, sowing and harvesting. They help us to think about what we are investing in, what are we planting in our lives right now and what kind of a harvest will that reap for our futures? Are we investing time and energy in what really matters to us, or just going through the motions? They also help us to pinpoint what season of life we are in – is it summer and we have lots of energy and sunshine to help us grow new things, or are we in a winter season when things are coming to an end and need to be cut back hard to allow for new shoots to emerge in spring? Have we been hibernating during Covid and now need to come out and seek nourishment?

In church, we are looking to the future and making plans for new things. We are taking responsibility for our local environmental impact and making changes to tread more lightly on the earth. We will be working in partnership with the Parish Council and our village primary school to do this. One of the main planks of this work is to improve the environment in the graveyard, and we will be asking residents to remove plastic items and lights from the graves which make a negative impact on wildlife, and offering free bulbs to be planted on graves instead. We will invest in some new benches and plant some wildflower areas. There will be a public meeting to explain this in more detail, open to all with an interest in the graveyard, on Monday 11th October in the Village Hall at 7.30pm. Please do come along to hear the plans.

Our PCC has made a commitment to install a loo and kitchen area in the church, a much needed improvement for all who come to services or for funerals and weddings. We will share more as plans unfold. Whatever season of life you are in, I wish you a blessed autumn and a harvest of goodness in your life. Rev Kim x



Walk 8: Whelford and Dudgrove public footpaths



Distance 3.68mi

Moving Time **1:00:53**

Pace 16.31/mi

Almost smashed the sub-one hour barrier today albeit for only 3.68 miles! This month we start from the Whelford Pools Nature Reserve. Sadly we have to carefully walk on the road up to Whelford, crossing the Coln (Pic 1), before getting to the bend where the Jenner's

Barn sign is. Please be careful, and if you have children I suggest you drop them off with an adult on the Jenner's Barn road before parking the car at the Whelford Pool finishing point. Down that road you will come to where the road goes off to the left to the Jenner's Barn. We need, however, to carry straight on until the Tjunction is reached where we make a left onto what is now a farm track with super tall trees alongside (black poplar?). Carry on past the

stile/gate where the footpath arrow will give you some idea of the bearing in the field. The walk goes past a beautiful but small cotswold stone barn - Pic 2 doesn't do it justice. Walking to the left of the barn you will come to a metal gate with a bit missing which allows you to get through if you can get down on your hands and knees!. Walk straight across the next field to the line of trees and turn left.





When the line of trees finishes, go off at about "2 o'clock" and look for the corner of the field and the field exit - there are a couple of fairly tall willow trees and an ash tree to aim for. Having exited the field by the correct exit hopefully, go left and follow the hedge around (there is one mini ditch to cross). This walk is an anti-clockwise one so if in doubt go left. However at the end of the hedge don't go left into the adjoining field, but go straight over an overgrown bridge and then turn left - there is a green sign here telling you that it is a public right of way (PROW) - see Pic 3. Some of you that have "beaten the bounds" may now start to recognize where you are - we are getting close to Dudgrove. Another left and follow the track to the Dudgrove road, where you guessed it we turn left and then cross the Coln (pic 4). Yippee some of you say we have crossed the river an even number of times so must be on the side we started. However, we have a bit of tarmac first before we get to the PROW into Lakes by You, which will be on your right just before the bend in the road (Pic 5). After you have entered LbY look very soon for a gap in the hedge on your left. This will get you off the estate road and onto a traditional footpath running parallel with the road. Very soon you will see a new footbridge on the left. This is the new footpath we walked the other way around in one of the earlier WOTMs. Going this way around you can see the PROW sign on the bridge (Pic 6) - don't think there is one at the other end. You will also see some of the latest LbY offerings, the architecture of which you may or may not like! Follow this new path until you go by the 2 new benches and get to the new bridge at the end. The first bench is so high off the ground that even I at 5' 11" + 3-quarters of an inch at my last "old man" med-









ical cannot touch the ground! Don't know which is the worst - being told you are not 6ft or having dangly legs on a bench. Having crossed the new bridge, walk for about 200-300m with the Conservation Lake on your right before turning left into the WPNR by the interpretation board. So a shorter walk and again I didn't meet anyone - shame about the road at the start.
