Dear Friends,

I do hope that you have had a good summer. As we enter September it's odd but it seems to me that there is always a sense of a fresh start. Regardless of whether we have family members at school, college or university or we ourselves are involved with schools, colleges or universities as pupils, students, teachers or support workers there is something about September that cries out time to start that new project! As a Headmaster I was always aware that any new initiative for the new academic year needed to begin in September since by October we would be overwhelmed with just keeping everything else going! Maybe it is just me!

Nevertheless I would like to outline three new initiatives. One this month, and one starting next month The first is the new style village fete. Building on the tradition of the **autumn fayre** established by statute by Henry III in 1215 it aims to take all that's best about the village fete and remix it in a new format that will suit both young and old alike. Taking place at the Church there will be the usual silver band and cream teas, and the lavish cakes stall, book stall and produce stall. But there will be a chance to climb the Church tower and to bid for the some of the special seasonal produce that will be available after the Harvest Festival the following day, when there will be a bring and share harvest lunch after the service.

The second initiative involves the **football club and youth Group.** Building on the popularity of the football club and recognising that the current youth group is getting older and not attracting new members, with those aged 12-15 notably absent, we have decided to make the following changes. Throughout September and October there will be no Youth Group but football club will continue to meet as normal until it becomes too dark to do so. At this point Chris and Alix, supported by the existing youth group leaders, and those members of the existing youth group who wish to be junior leaders, will start running an indoor club with table tennis, snooker and darts competitions for the 'old' football club. This will become the new Youth Group and will run from 6-8:30 and be open to anyone aged 8-14

The third new initiative I can not yet describe, because no decisions have yet been made, but it will involve the complete rethinking of how the South Cotswolds team operates in the future. At the inauguration of John Swanton, Vicar of The Ampneys as Team Rector in July, the Bishop made it clear that once the newly appointed Vicar of Fairford arrives, and a new Vicar is appointed to the CHEQS parishes, we will need to think very carefully about how we work together as a team and how we deploy our human resources, both lay and ordained. This is likely to have particular implications for those parishes deemed strong enough and vibrant enough to flourish with less ordained support. Kempsford is likely to be effected in some way!

Finally I want to pay tribute to two wonderful village ladies who died in August, Anne Arkell and Liz Scott. Both will be greatly missed as pillars of the church, stalwarts of the community, and as shining lovely people who were kind, generous hearted and full of the Holy Spirit. 1 Progress to date, working from north to south of the site:

- Beginning of the year the farmer sowed a crop on the restored field to the east of the haul road –
 but could not spray the weeds at the correct time of year because of the wet ground conditions
- Some scrub clearance has been carried out on the west side of the small lake to gain access around the wet hole left by the removal of the below ground level top soil store
- Now begun filling the wet hole next to the lake from south to north using appropriate inert stockpiled rubble and overburden stored immediately adjacent to the south
- Remaining part of field east of haul route being restored with soils, some from on site, some imported. A little over half of this remaining northern area has now been top soiled

2 Next stages for the period to end of September 2014:

- Remaining part of eastern field to be soiled
- Farmer wants to follow this in September with a crop of winter wheat
- Intention is to retain haul route as a farm access
- Land south east of the haul route to be restored to pasture
- Stockpiles of soils and rubble and overburden will be removed which will involve use both of a soil screen and a crusher as necessary. Crushed material will be used on site, anything unusable will be removed
- Restoration is on course for completion by the end of September

3 Improvements to the unclassified highway

There have been discussions with Gloucestershire Highway officers, and it has been agreed that Earthline Ltd will raise the level of the track at the far 'wet' end close by the present haul road from the quarry into the lake area. This will be done over the coming weeks using suitable material from the stockpiles referred to above, soils will then be replaced over the top to ensure that the character of the track is kept.

4 Future extraction and lake restoration

We are continuing to develop a scheme that is likely to involve some more gravel extraction adjacent the unclassified highway, and some infilling of the large lake in order to reduce its scale.

This is a slow process, but when we are sufficiently advanced we will carry out local consultation before an application is submitted.

Petition to re-open Public Footpath BLE44 at Bowmoor Lake, Lechlade

The Parish Council has created a petition which our County Councillor Ray Theodoulou will be presenting at the September meeting of the County Council.

Petition summary and background - In 2007 footpath users successfully proved that they had walked around this lake for over 20 years, and the Planning Inspectorate granted it be added to the definitive map. In January 2008, a week after the footpath was added to the definitive map, sections of it were closed under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 for the construction of Lakes by Yoo holiday lodges. 6.5yrs later after many meetings and attempts to negotiate with the developer, no sections of the path have been reopened, despite development in some areas being complete. The developer has openly admitted they do not want the path reopened on its definitive line.

Action petitioned for - To request Gloucestershire County Council (GCC) to take all steps possible to reopen public footpath BLE44 at Bowmoor Lake, Lechlade which has been closed for more than 6 years. GCC should ensure that the developer Coln Park is fully aware of the serious concerns expressed by local residents and request that the Planning Inspectorate, who are responsible for granting extensions to footpath closures, visit the site.

Bin it, don't Block it



Leftover cooking fat and oil poured down the sink will set hard. This creates stinking, pipe-blocking fatbergs beneath your house or in your street.

Wet wipes are another big no-no because they are made of plastic. They don't break down like toilet tissue, clinging to fat and clogging up the system. If drains get blocked, what you flush can come back up through your toilet or even your sink.

At Thames Water, we clear around 55,000 blockages from our sewers each year at a cost of £12m and 7,000 customers suffer from sewer flooding in their homes and gardens – a truly miserable experience.

To flush, or not to flush?

The drains connected to your home were not designed to cope with anything other than wastewater, toilet tissue and human waste.

Even the products labelled 'flushable' do not break down in the sewer. Flushing them could block your internal plumbing or the main sewer, causing sewage to back-up.

The message is simple, if it's not water, toilet tissue or poo, please... bin it - don't block it.

Thousands of unsuitable products are washed down the drain each year contributing to around 55,000 blockages across the Thames Water region.

This is made worse by confusing and misleading product labelling, which encourages customers to flush unsuitable items, particularly toddler wipes and sanitary items. Although these items disappear when you flush your loo, they can take a number of years to break down. There are currently no restrictions in place to prevent these products being sold as 'flushable'.

The only product to pass water industry 'flushability' tests so far is toilet paper. Manufacturers have their own tests, which are more lenient resulting in a greater number of products being labelled 'flushable'.

News from RAF Fairford - September 2014

RAF Fairford is home to the USAF 420th Air Base Squadron, which is part of the 501st Combat Support Wing based at RAF Alconbury in Cambridgeshire. The base is maintained in a ready, "warm status" by a civilian workforce who are responsible for all daily tasks and contingency preparations.

The main mission at RAF Fairford is to be ready to receive a deployment of aircraft and personnel with 48 hours' notice, both for real-world scenarios and for training.

The Special Operations Group exercise planned for the end of July was postponed at the last minute, which means that the airfield was quiet after all RIAT aircraft had departed! However, RAF Fairford will be hosting an MoD emergency services training exercise, starting on Thursday 11th September. This exercise will involve around 350 additional personnel on the base, and civil emergency services vehicles (fire, police and ambulance) travelling to and from the base. Local residents may notice some additional activity around the base at this time, but should be aware that the exercise is not based on any current or real world events, and will be concluded by 15th September. Residents should not be alarmed by any increase in activity and emergency services vehicles during this time period.

The emergency services training exercise will not include any aircraft operations, although routine flight operations will take place as usual during the month.
