PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

- As many of you know, Tony Williams retired as a Parish Councillor earlier this year after serving for 30 years. In recognition of his outstanding service, we will be presenting him with a gift at the Village Fete on Saturday 9th September. It would be great to see you there to show your appreciation.
- We still have one councillor vacancy to fill by co-option. Councillors will be present at the Village Fete if you are interested in filling this position and would like to discuss.
- The Parish Council was thrilled to receive a new 'Smiley Face' vehicle activated sign as part of the Gloucestershire County Council Community Speedwatch Fund. Feedback from parishioners has been very positive.
- Kempsford now has an active Speed Watch Group led by Andy Lee. If anyone is interested in joining the group, please contact Andy on alee32@btinternet.com
- An additional AutoSpeedWatch camera for Whelford has also been provided through the above scheme and we are awaiting installation of a new pole and signage from Gloucestershire Highways. Speeding has always been a problem through Whelford and with the increased traffic due to the Lechlade Bridge closure is even worse. In one hour recently 10 vehicles travelling between 60 and 70mph were recorded, and this is in a 30mph speed limit!


August is normally a quieter month for the Parish Council due to the holiday season. This year it has been a busy month and below is some of the work we have been involved in -

- ♦ Councillors recently attended a 'wash-up' meeting with the RIAT organisers to feedback issues arising from this year's show and how things can be improved in the future.
- A meeting was held with Kempsford Quarry, and Gloucestershire County Council to discuss their revised restoration plans involving water flows. We await revised plans incorporating our concerns, including taking account of the Whelford Flood Relief Scheme.
- Councillors are due to meet with our Local Gloucestershire Highways Manager shortly to discuss all highway matters within the Parish.
- And finally, a meeting has been organised with Gloucestershire County Council and Cotswold District Council Enforcement to discuss the community facilities at Hazel View, Kempsford. As many of you know, the facilities remain in the ownership and responsibility of Persimmon Homes as they have not been constructed to the standard required to be transferred to the Parish Council. The aim of this meeting is to find a way forward to rectify this and complete the transfer.

Please be advised of the following Road Closure - High Street, Kempsford This road will be closed (as per the attached plan) from 09:30 to 15:30 on 13/11/23 to allow for pole testing work by Openreach.

Emergency and pedestrian access will be maintained.

Are you struggling with damp and mould in your home?

Our Research and Campaigns team have been gathering evidence about the problem as we have seen a significant increase in the number of people coming to us about it.

There are many types of damp, the most common ones being rising, penetrating, construction and condensation damp. On our website (www.citizensadvice.org.uk) there is information that may help you work out what type of damp you have, who is responsible and what you can do.

It is important to keep homes well-heated and well-ventilated to prevent damp and mould – you may be eligible for help to insulate and heat your home.

If you are a tenant it can be difficult to work out if your landlord is responsible - check your tenancy agreement for mentions of repairs and damp. A landlord will have to act in relation to damp if it makes the property unsafe for someone to live in. The landlord will also be responsible if the damp is related to repairs they should have carried out. If the damp has damaged items that the landlord is responsible for, such as carpets and window frames, they'll likely have to cover the cost of repairs.

If your landlord is responsible for the damp in your property but doesn't act, there are steps you can take, such as reporting them to the local authority. If you're in social housing you might also be able to use the landlord's formal complaints procedure.

Flood Defence

The geology surrounding our villages is predominantly sand and gravel and underneath lies a thick Oxford Clay. When rain falls steadily our natural drainage is very good, the water seeps through the gravel and is absorbed slowly by the clay. Our problems may arise when rain is intense and a lot of water is deposited quickly. This means the clay cannot absorb it quickly enough so the water sits on top and rises through the gravel. Our area has very high groundwater and you do not have to dig down far to find it!

We have in the past had flooding within the villages and recently some very close calls where water has risen across the surrounding fields and got very near to properties. We have the Rivers Coln and Thames very nearby and when they flood there is no natural drainage for the land and groundwater will just rise and rise.

Our worries are also compounded by the complexity of efficiently draining the quarries, any excavation of that size alters the underground flows. We are constantly in dialogue with all the stakeholders to try and ensure this is managed effectively for the long term.

What we ask is you do your bit by not adding excess surface water to the problem. Significant amounts of water enter the drainage systems from our homes and this can be correctly managed by Thames Water. Again, we urge you to ensure all drains are kept clear and guttering is not leaking, this is essential not just for you but all the neighbourhood!


Its mid-summer yet we have seen torrential downpours which the ground cannot handle. Thankfully they have abated without serious implications but we would ask that you are prepared. There are 'flood sax' available online which are easy to store and only inflate when saturated. There is plenty of good advice on the Environment Agency website about protection for the home. We all hope none of this is necessary and doing your bit helps us all.






Britain's biggest professional cycle race, the Tour of Britain, is coming to Gloucestershire this September as the county hosts stage seven of the 2023 race.



On Saturday, 9 September, the race will start in Tewkesbury and finish in Gloucester. The riders will head east into the Cotswolds, before heading south, then coming up through the Stroud district, and finishing by Gloucester Docks.

A new way to report highways issues – coming soon...



As part of the highways transformation programme we're bringing in a brand new online report it system for highways. The solution is called – Fix My Street and it's widely used by many other local authorities across the country. The benefits of the system are:

- It's really easy to use
- Everyone can see live issues so less duplicate reporting
- All reports go straight into the back office getting issues sorted quickly
- Updates provided to customer on how work is progressing
- Clear picture of all the work going on in the county



What can be reported?

A huge variety of issues can be reported using the interactive map from potholes to damaged traffic lights, broken street lighting, flooding or drainage issues through to road markings or grass verge issues.

What does this mean for me?

If you regularly report highways issues you need to be aware of the following:

- Phasing out of email while we will still have telephone support for those that
 really need it and for emergencies, we want to promote channel shift to this way of
 reporting as a priority. This will be more efficient and save a lot of time. Therefore,
 we'll be phasing out email reporting.
- Spread the word if you ever report issues by email or work with organisations who use that channel you can help us by spreading the word to them about this change. We're also asking anyone that promotes the email address whether it's a councillor, another council we're asking them to get replace the email address with the Fix My Street link when it's ready hopefully in September.

We'd like to know your thoughts on the system once it's gone live and we'll remind you when it does and give you a way to tell us what you think.

It can be life-changing for a young person to have a trusted independent adult to talk to. This is especially true for those referred to Gloucestershire Mentoring Programme, a service that trains and supports volunteer mentors to fulfil this role. Demand for the service is high and the organisers are currently looking to expand their pool of volunteers – locals who are empowering young people in their communities to make positive changes and realise their potential. If you're interested and would like to find out more, the organisers would be pleased to see you at their online information event on 20th September, 7 – 8pm. Gloucestershire Mentoring Programme is run by a collaboration of trusted organisations and hosted by The Door. It supports 10 – 25 year old girls and young women whose life circumstances suggest they're at risk of becoming involved in crime. This can be because they've had Adverse Childhood Experiences or live in environments that are known to put them at risk, or because they've become linked to criminal activity, either as victims of crime or through relationships with offenders. The Programme operates across Gloucestershire and South Gloucestershire and offers these "at risk" young people the chance to form a long-lasting relationship with a trained volunteer mentor. This relationship with a trusted adult is something that's often been missing in the lives of such young people, and it can be transformational.

Anyone can become a mentor. You just need a heart for understanding and supporting young people and a little spare time (about an hour or so a week). Full training is provided.
