Following the recent accident at Top Road Corner and numerous complaints regarding problems with large lorries navigating the Allotment's Corner junction, the Parish Council is arranging to meet with Gloucestershire Highways representatives to see what can be done to improve safety at both these locations.

We are aware that there has been regular accidents at Top Road corner, however it would appear that many have not been reported as Police data provided only shows two accidents occurring at this location.

Whilst not wanting to see any further accidents, in order to provide evidence to support our request for safety measures we would appreciate any photographic evidence parishioners can collect.

**Please don't place broken
glass in your kerbside
recycling box**



Over the last few weeks, crew members working for Cotswold District **Council's waste service provider, Ubico Ltd**, have sustained cuts when emptying recycling boxes containing broken glass.

This is a significant health and safety hazard and Ubico has instructed crews not to collect boxes when they see that they contain broken glass. However, there may be times when the hazard is not apparent and we are urging the public to help avoid this risk.

Please follow these five simple steps to ensure that recycling is presented safely and considerately:

Step 1 – Use one black recycling box for paper and magazines. (If you only have room for one box - put the papers at one end and the glass at the other).

Step 2 – Use a second black recycling box for all glass bottles and jars - no broken glass please. (Order a second box if you need one).

Step 3 - Use the white recycling sack for tins/cans, aerosols, plastic bottles, food trays, yoghurt pots and other types of mixed rigid plastics.

Step 4 – Use the blue recycling sack for corrugated (brown coloured) cardboard or light (grey coloured) card.

Step 5 – Use the green caddy for food waste.

Residents with broken glass are advised to wrap it in newspaper and place it in the grey waste bin for collection.

Christmas and New Year waste collection changes

Release date: 12 October 2018

Cotswold District Council's waste and recycling collection service provider, Ubico Ltd, will be making normal collections up to and including Friday 21 December.

The collection days will change as follows: (*please note that crews will be working on four Saturdays – 29 December, 5 January, 12 January and 19 January – to catch up.*)

Normal collection day	New revised collection day
Friday 21 Dec	No change
Friday 28 Dec	Will move to Wednesday 2 Jan 2019
Friday 4 Jan	Will move to Tues 8 Jan
Friday 11 Jan	Will move to Monday 14 Jan
Friday 18 Jan	Will move to Saturday 19 Jan

The collection schedule will return to normal on the week beginning Monday 21 January 2019.

Please also note that Christmas trees can be taken to the following Garden Centres after Christmas for recycling up until 13 January 2019. (Once collected they are turned into peat-free compost):

- Dobbies Garden Centre, Cirencester, GL7 6EU
- Batsford Garden Centre, Batsford, GL56 9QB (will be taking trees from 6th January)
- Wyevale Garden Centre, Lechlade, GL7 3DP

Commenting on the arrangements, Cllr Sue Coakley, CDC's Cabinet Member for Environment, said:

"We anticipate that households will accumulate larger amounts of waste during Christmas and New Year. I would urge everyone to recycle as much as possible and to make the most of our kerbside recycling services, and recycling facilities across the district. Many large gifts use cardboard packaging and it is worth emphasising that the Ubico crews will only collect folded cardboard at the kerbside. We also encourage everyone to recycle all the extra bottles that seem to accumulate over the festive season.

"For those who like to clear things away very quickly, please note that Household Recycling Centres will be open on most days during the holiday period. However, please note that both Household Recycling Centres in Cotswold District now close for one day during the week (Fosse Cross on Tuesdays and Pyke Quarry on Wednesdays). Both will be closed on Christmas Day, Boxing Day and New Year's Day. The new winter opening hours are 10 am to 4 pm. For more details see www.recycleforgloucestershire.com.

"While we hope to see a big upturn in recycling figures during this period, we realise that there is still going to be a build-up of non-recyclable waste at such a busy time. For this reason, we will be allowing a 'side waste amnesty' for every household's first full collection after Christmas Day; residents will be able to leave out additional amounts of non-recyclable waste in bin liners next to their grey wheeled bin/beige refuse bags. Please place all containers at the kerbside by 7 am on the revised day of collection so we can ensure that everything is picked up."

RC-135 RIVET JOINT to Relocate to RAF Fairford

Release No. 18-11-01

RAF ALCONBURY, United Kingdom -- The U.S. Air Force's 95th Reconnaissance Squadron and 488th Intelligence Squadron will relocate its RC-135 RIVET JOINT mission from RAF Mildenhall to RAF Fairford as part of the European Infrastructure Consolidation.

Approximately 530 military personnel and 740 family members will move to the areas around RAF Fairford. The relocation enables U.S. Air Forces in Europe-Air Forces Africa to reduce excess capacity without any loss of operational capabilities.

The move is expected to begin in 2023 and be complete by 2024.

All RC-135s are permanently assigned to the 55th Wing, Air Combat Command, Offutt Air Force Base, Nebraska. They will use RAF Fairford as a Forward Operating Location and will deploy as required from the U.S. as they currently do at RAF Mildenhall. The 95th RS and 488th IS provide intelligence collection, analysis and dissemination capabilities.

Seasonal Increase In Residential Burglaries

Gloucestershire police want to make residents aware of the normal rise in seasonal burglaries.

Residential burglaries always increase as soon as the clocks change when afternoon's become darker.

Our advice is to set a timer for lights to come on earlier in the evenings if you are at out or at work. You can also purchase TV Flicker plug ins, keep a radio on.

Keep curtains half closed so opportunists cannot look into your property.

Alarm and CCTV system have dramatically dropped in price and some are able to be fitted by a competent DIY enthusiast.

Remember to shut all windows and lock all doors, even if just popping into a rear garden.

This should help reduce the seasonal upturn in burglaries.
